Health and safety update for university community members

Message from Vice Chancellor and President Joan Ferrini-Mundy:

Dear members of the UMaine and UMM communities,

Our This Is Our Shot, Maine vaccination campaign continues across the UMS campuses, promoting the importance of vaccinations for our health and safety, and the well-being of those we love. Like the COVID-19 health and safety protocols — wearing face coverings, maintaining social

distancing, avoiding large gatherings, handwashing and testing — vaccinations can save lives. Please do your part and get vaccinated if you are able to do so.

The UMS Science Advisory Board and Vaccine Planning and Partnership Task Force are surveying students, faculty and staff to assess vaccination plans, and determine how best to provide information and educational materials to university community members. To date, the survey has received over 4,200 voluntary responses, representing about 13% of the surveyed population of students and employees. The responses suggest a strong commitment to vaccination across the university system, with over half of respondents indicating they had received at least one dose. Just over 70% of those who have not yet received a dose reported that they plan to. These are preliminary findings as the survey will remain open until the end of next week.

We are encouraged by these preliminary results and will be continuing our work to support and educate our community about the importance of vaccination. [Information about vaccination sites is on the Maine CDC website.](#)

Partnering to address health

- Following consultation with state public health officials, UMS is exempting fully vaccinated, asymptomatic individuals from quarantine requirements if they come into close contact with someone who has COVID-19. Individuals are considered fully vaccinated 14 days after receiving a J&J inoculation, or 14 days after their second Pfizer or Moderna injection. - This week in UMaine Athletics, the men's and women's track & field program continues competition at the George Davis Invitational, hosted by UMass Lowell, on Friday and Saturday afternoon. Baseball hosts Hartford for doubleheaders at noon on Saturday and

Sunday. All four games can be seen at [AmericaEast.TV](#) and heard across the [Black Bear Sports Network](#). The softball team travels to Binghamton for a four-game weekend set beginning with a doubleheader at noon on Saturday. The softball series closes with another doubleheader at 11 a.m. on Sunday. All games can be seen at [AmericaEast.TV](#). The diving team competes at the America East Championships, hosted at Binghamton University, on Saturday and Sunday. Field Hockey closes its regular season on Sunday when it hosts UC Davis at 10 a.m. live at [AmericaEast.TV](#). Reminder: No spectators are permitted at home games, following health and safety guidelines.

- For the next three Fridays — April 23, April 30, May 7, weather permitting — assistant professor of philosophy Don Beith is again leading contemplative nature walks on the University Forest trails. Participants gather at the trailhead near the New Balance Student Recreation Center at noon and return by approximately 1 p.m. Social distancing and face covering guidelines are in effect. That virtual presentation will feature elements of our traditional in-person commencement ceremony, such as messages from campus leadership, speakers and music, as well as photos of all graduates who opt to submit images. May 8 would have been the date for the in-person commencement if we had been able to have it. The virtual presentation is later in May to ensure time for all video and photos to be submitted from the Class of 2021 and 2020, and edited.
