Asymptomatic fully-vaccinated students, staff and faculty are in general exempted from COVID-19 testing and quarantine requirements if they are fully vaccinated and provide verification of their fully vaccinated status to the University. You can provide verification on [our COVID-19 testing and vaccine verification platform](#).

In general, people are considered fully vaccinated:

- Two (2) weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, such as the Pfizer or Moderna, or
- Two (2) weeks after a single-dose vaccine, such as Johnson & Johnson's/Janssen.

To provide verification of vaccination, visit [the vaccination submission form](#) and select the "submit vaccination information" option.

The quarantine and testing exemptions are available effective now to those who submit verification. Again, verification of vaccination can be provided by [visiting the vaccination submission form](#) and select the "submit vaccination information" option.

Note that this and all University guidance on COVID-19 is subject to change in accordance with the evolving circumstances of COVID-19.
