Dear Kathleen, Francois, and Committee members:

Project Mainestay is a Title VII ESL/Bilingual Education Teachers and Personnel Training Grant funded by the United States Department of Education. This is the second year in the five-year grant cycle. Demographics indicate that we have a significant number of limited English proficient students who are under-served in our k-12 population. The primary goal of this grant is to ensure that limited English proficient students are successful in their educational endeavor. Currently UMaine offers courses which meet the requirements for the State of Maine ESL endorsement. UMaine offers semester length courses during the semester and shorter, more intensive summer institutes. We are currently working to develop the necessary courses to satisfy the requirements for the bilingual education endorsement.


As part of this initiative, we are proud to announce that Stephen Krashen will visit Maine this fall. Dr. Krashen is Professor in the Division of Learning and Instruction at the University of Southern California. He received his Ph.D. from the University of California, Los Angeles. Stephen Krashen's specialties and areas of research include language acquisition, literacy development, and bilingual education. Recent publications include *The Power of Reading* (Libraries Unlimited), *Under Attack: The Case Against Bilingual Education* (Language Education Associates) and *Three Arguments Against Whole Language and Why They Are Wrong* (Heinemann). Dr. Krashen is a recipient of the Pimsleur Award given by the American Council of Foreign Language Teaching, and the Mildenberg Award given by the Modern Language Association.

The total cost for the Stephen Krashen visit is \$5339.61; we are asking for \$3000. We realize that the committee does not usually provide funding for more than half of an event but we hope that it will make an exception in this case.
