Mrs. Calista Blackwood was buried today. Funeral in the Grove School-house. Thomas, Edna and I were there. Father went as one of the pall-bearers. She was buried to the Clark side.

Grandpa Carter came out here this morning after mama to go out and stay with aunt Hellen who is very sick. untill he went to ~~pampaneting~~ after grandma. that he carried away yesterday.

Thur. Sept. 3.

Windy. looked like rain. We churned this morning and washed after we got done churning. had a very thunder-shower about (eleven) o'clock to-night.

Fri Sept 4  
Pleasant.

We had callers this afternoon  
Mrs Adniram Wilder, and  
Mrs Hannah Wilder.

Sat Sept 5  
We churned two churnings  
this morning. grandpa went  
to Eastport this morning and  
brought papa and uncle Elias  
home to - night.

Sun Sept 6  
grandpa and uncle Arthur  
came out a little while

Sat - Oct. 17 - 1896  
Elias and I came home from E-port to night.

Factory's "cut" wages. - Men will not work.  
Mon. - 18 - 19 -

I dug some potatoes - fenced - got cows, etc.  
Tues - 19 - 20 -

Dug potatoes - went to the Corner to night.  
Wed - 20 - 21 -

Elias and I went to E-port - no work.  
Thurs. 21 - 22 -

Dug potatoes Hauled and spread manure.  
Fri. - 23 -

Dug potatoes - Mrs. Smith came over -  
Sat. - 24 -

Big rain storm and blow - Churned, etc.  
Sun. - 25 -

Children and I went to church.  
Mon. - 26 -

Banked the barn. - Went to the Corner. - Inspected  
Tues - 27 -

Clara, Estella and I went to Eastport.

Wed, Oct. 28, 1896

Canoll, Estella, Thomas have chicken-pox - Dug potatoes.

- Thurs, 29 -

Rainy. - Dug a few potatoes - Mother came out -  
I went over to see Dr. Best about my back -

- Fri. - 30 -

Dull. - I got 500 ft. <sup>240</sup> pine boards - Clara and I  
went to the Corner this afternoon -

- Sat. 31 -

Rainy. - Finished shingling ell - Worked under barn.

- Sun. Nov. 1 - 1896 -

Dull. - Clara, I and Mr. Smith went to Church.

- Mon. - 2 -

Dull. - I fixed the front of barn. Pulled carrots.

Tues, 3 - National Election.

- McKinley and Hobart -

I dug a few potatoes - Went to the Polls;  
Mr. Smith went over with me.

Went over to the Camp to night.

- Wed - 4 -

Dug potatoes - Clara went out to Mother's,  
Father dug potatoes -

Thurs, Nov. 5, 1896

Dug potatoes - Mr. Smith dug for me.

- Fri - 6 -

Big rain and blow last night. - Finished pulling  
Carrots, turnips, parsnips, etc. Worked round the barn.

- Sat - 7 -

Churned - Hauled over 6 Bbl.  
potatoes to Hobart.

- Sunday - 8 -

The children went to S. School.

- Mon - 9 -

Sold Hobart 6 Bbl. more potatoes - Bought  
a load of straw of Allie Anthony.

- Tues - 10 -

Mr. Smith, Elias, and I went to Eastport with  
my team, this fore-noon; no work - Dug potatoes  
this afternoon.

- Wed. - 11 -

Dug potatoes this fore-noon - Rained P.M.  
I lashed some.

- Thurs - 12 -

Walled some under the ell.



- Fri. - Nov. 13, 1896 -

Chummed - Dug potatoes - Sathred.

- Sat. - 14 -

Cold. Went to the Corner. - Worked round the farm.  
Went out to father's this evening - The boys went <sup>up</sup> to Jesse's.

Sun - 15 -

Rainy - Clara and I went over to other house <sup>(to dining)</sup>

Mon - 16 -

Snowed. - Cold - Sathred in kitchen, etc.

Tue - 17 -

Father helped me dig potatoes. Mr. Smith dug  
this afternoon (25 bush.) - Went to the Camp.

Wed. - 18 -

Wet P.M. - Finished digging potatoes (20 bush.)

Father and Mr. Smith helped me. Sathred.

Thurs. - 19 -

Clara and I went to the Corner. - Picked over potatoes <sup>Sathred.</sup>

Fri - 20 -

Chummed - Banked House - Sathred.

Sat - 21 -

Snowed P.M. - Mr. Smith helped me kill my hog.  
Mrs. Antone was here to dinner.

- Sun. - Nov. 22 - 1896 -

Clara, Carroll, Father and I went to the Vestry.

- Mon - 23 -

Hauled water - Dug sand - Bought cask of lime, etc.  
Got telegram to go to Eastport tomorrow.

- Tues - 24 -

Elias and I went to E-port. Will carried  
us down. Elias did not stay. Clara taken sick.

Wed - 25 -

Clara pretty sick - Carroll went after Clara.  
Amen to-night.

- Thanksgiving - 26 -

Mother came out. Clara still pretty sick.

Fri - 27 -

Clara some better. Clara <sup>over</sup> went home to night.  
Char over slacked lime.

Sat - 28 -

Elias came to Eastport after me.

Mon. & Tues - Nov. 30 - Dec 1.

Uncle Sam plastered my kitchen - Mr. Smith  
and Father helped. (Dec. 10 -)
