Father and James with the boys got in my oats today. Helen came out today, visiting.

Sat. 20 -

Clara and Kenin went over to the Comer this afternoon, visited three sardine factories, etc. Carroll went too. I came home with them.

Mr. Smith went to Eastport after Elias.

Sun - 21 -

The children and I went over to Sunday School this forenoon.

Mon - 22 -

Clara churned, etc, and then went out to Helen's

Sunday, Sept. 4, 1898-

Father started to carry James to Machias enroute for Deer Isle where he will teach the high school.

Monday - 5-

Mrs. Smith carried Kenie to Eastport, enroute for Lowell.

Tuesday - 7-

I moved from the "Kildale" (Whiff) factory this afternoon and set up at the "Hobart" factory. Henry Carter took my place.

Saturday - 13

Mother got home from Mass. where she has been for several weeks. Lizzie came with her. Father went to Eastport after them.

Monday, Sept. 12, 1898-
State Election.

I did not work in the factory to-day, having to attend the election all day.

Wed., Sept. 14, 1898-

Clara and I and Estella, attended the funeral services of Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Brown's little child this afternoon; then went across to the Falls and then down to John Carter's where we saw a gravel train of cars, and saw gravel loaded with a team's shovel; then home. We went round to father's this evening; stopped at Jos. Dumm's and bought a pig.

Thurs. - 15-

Mother, Helen and Lizzie came out this forenoon. Mother went home to night, but Helen and Lizzie will stay all night. - I went up to Geo. Jones's to see a horse he has to sell. Hauled in potatoes, thrashed buckwheat etc.

Friday, Sept. 16, 1898-

I bought a horse of W. W. Woodworth (John) for \$55.00 (\$25. cash down and the bal, \$30. next March) and my horse Tom.

Sat - Oct. 1-

Will and Sarah came in this forenoon with horse and carriage and Mrs. Smith went down home with them and will stay all night and come home tomorrow evening.

Tues - Oct. 4 -
Very warm.

Sat, Oct. 15 -

Big rain storm. Wind blowed very hard.

Sat., Oct. 22-98-

Big rain storm and flow

We finished making Cans
yesterday for a while

Tues- 25-

~~Friday~~ - Killed heifer - Father's help
Mother and Helen came.

Thursday - 27-

Rained and blowed very
hard all of last night and
this forenoon. Big storm.

Sunday - 30-

Uncle Thom Brown died
last night after a few days ill-
ness. Doctors probably did not
know his disease.

Monday - 31-

We went to the funeral of Un-
cle Thom Brown this afternoon.

- Tues., Nov. 1, 1898-

Mrs. Balinda Orr died this
morning, after a few weeks illness.
I pulled carrots and turnips.

Went over to the Camp to night.

- Wed - 2 -

Pulled Turnips.

Mrs. Smith has been very sick
today; I went over to the factory
and got Sarah this afternoon; she
will stay all night.

Thurs - 3 -

Went to work in the factory
today, after being idle about 12
days.

Friday - 4 -

Mrs. Smith is a little
better.

- Sunday, Nov. 6, 1898 -

Home - Rained quite hard all day.

- Friday, - Nov. 11 -

After I got home from the factory, we picked up seven barrels of potatoes for Will. Woodworth.

- Saturday - 12 -

Finished making cans this forenoon - probably for this year.

Albert Holland came in and got the potatoes we picked up last evening, and one barrel of Mrs. Smith. - I attended Quarterly Conference at the Vestry this evening, also went to the Lodge.

- Sunday, Nov. 13 - 1898 -

Clara, Estella and I went over to the Vestry this evening to Quarterly Meeting. - Preaching by Besick, Elder Mr. Day.

Tuesday - 15 -

Killed my hog today - Father and Elias helped me.

Wednesday - 16 -

I plowed in the orchard. Carroll stayed from school. Capt. and Mrs. S. W. Smith came in to Mrs. Smith's this forenoon; both came over here to dinner. Clara Owen came over this forenoon; went home before supper. Charles came in after his - missed her - and stayed to supper. - Clara and I went to the S. A. S.

-Thurs, Nov. 17-1898-

We went to the "Circle" to
Mrs. J. D. Sumner.

Friday - 18-

I cut up and salted pork.

Commenced making cans. this
afternoon.

Sat. - 19-

Made cans - Big rain this after-
noon and evening. - 24 members
of "Friendship" Lodge, I. O. O. F. of
Calais came down to visit Geo.
Washington Lodge. - It rained so
hard, I did not get over.

Jesse Cushing - age 17 years
died this morning after a long ill-
ness. - Richard Robinson - age
20 years - was shot dead to day
while gunning by some person unknown.

Sunday - Nov. 20-1898-

Clara, Carroll and I went over
to church this forenoon.

Monday - 21-

Finished making cans. this
forenoon - Went to the funeral
of Jesse Cushing this afternoon.
Services conducted by Mr. Will Allen.

Tues - 22-

Rain - Commenced to bank house.

Wed - 23-

Wet. - Banked some etc.

Thurs - 24-

Thanksgiving

Wet - I went to the Cornor with Clara
Banked some. Clara and I went
out to take supper with Father & Mother.

Fri, Nov. 25-1898-

Wet. - Clara and I started to go to Demmyville; got word to go to the factory. I set a pair of glass in the school-house and I went to the factory. Clara walked home.

Sat. - 26

Trade Cons. - I stayed over and went to the lodge. Father went after fumes to Knachias.

Sunday - 27

James and Father got home from Knachias about 5:30 this morning. James has just finished his school in Deer Isle. - Snowed and blowed very hard all day - Snow drifted very badly.

Monday, Nov. 28-1898-

Rained, snowed, hailed lightly and wind blowed hard all day.

I went to Demmyville to attend the trial of Otis S. Page charged with the murder of Richard Robinson, on Saturday Nov. 19th. Court adjourned to tomorrow at 10 o'clock A. M. W. R. Adlam trial justice. I got home at 8 o'clock this evening.

Tuesday - 29-

Cloudy - quite moderate. I went up to the trial this fore-noon, and the Court was still further adjourned to Tuesday Dec. 6th at 10 o'clock A. M. Clara went up to Chas. Smith's. We stayed to dinner, then went to the "Coma" before getting home.
