Wed. Nov. 30, 1898-

Cloudy - Snow to night.

I "fixed up" under the barn etc,

Thurs. Dec. 1-

Snowed a good part of last night and today. Fair sleighing today.

Clara and I went down to Albert Gardner's to the "bide"

I hauled two loads of wood in tonight.

Friday - 2-

I hauled a load of wood over to the Vestry this morning; finished hauling my wood in.

Mother came out this forenoon. Father brought her. He came out to dinner. Clara and I carried Mother home and stayed this evening to supper and the evening - Lewis met.

Sat., Dec. 3rd 1898-

I hauled gravel on the sled and banked the house.

I went over to the factory and got my pay, then went over to Roberts and got a barrel of flour (Stocks Best) \$6.20 in full of $\frac{3}{4}$

Sunday - 4-

Looked like a storm.

Carroll and Edna went over to the Vestry this evening.

Sunday - 5-

Snowed part of the forenoon; turned to rain and stormed and blowed very hard about all day. I cleaned part of the ceiling in the kitchen. - Elias came over.

-Tuesday- Dec 6-1898-

I attend the trial of Otis Page today: Continued all day and adjourned to tomorrow at 9:30 A.M. - Put my horse up at Chas. Smith's and he sharpened him - Clara dressed chicken.

-Wednesday- 7-

I attended the trial of Otis Page. He was discharged on the complaint of killing Richard Robinson, but was held in \$1000. bond (as also were Will Carter and Lewis Anthony) as accessories to the crime. I sold 24 lbs. of chicken to the "Riverside".

-Thursday- Dec. 8-1898-

After going to Xenyville to correct an error in payment for chicken yesterday, Thomas and I went to Eastport. Clara went over to Ida Bosworth's to the "bowl" and came back with us tonight.

Friday- 9-

I killed the remaining twin heifer (yearling) today. Elias helped me.

Saturday- 10-

I carried a quarter of beef out to mother this forenoon. I went over to a meeting of the Selectmen this afternoon; went over to the Lodge tonight. Sella will stow out to mother's tonight.

Sunday, Dec. 11, 1898-

Clara and I went over to the Vestry and then went up to see Gen. Brown. We called to Chas Ward's.

Mr. and Mrs. Chas Ward came in to Mr. Smith's.

-Monday- 12-

I made a cupboard in the kitchen this forenoon. This afternoon I went to the Corn and brought in a barrel of flour for Mr. Smith. Stella went with me.

-Tuesday- 13-

Went out to Father's and ground our axes.

-Wednesday, Dec. 14, 1898-

Pleasant, Very Cold. - 31°

I cut a little wood this afternoon.

-Thursday- 15-

Very Cold. - Clara and I went over to Miss Onelia Worth's to the "Circle"

-Friday- 16-

I went over to the Corn this morning. Thomas went with me. Snowed all of the forenoon. I put my riding-suit on over in Mr. Smith's barn, this afternoon. Wellington's horse fell down and broke his sled till over by Mr. Smith's.

- Saturday - Dec. 17 - 1898 -

Cut wood. I set glass in the hen-pen windows. I went over to the Lodge to night. The boys went over to the corner with me.

- Sunday - 18 -

Rained part of last night. Soft today. - I walked over to the Vestry to meeting this afternoon. - Mrs. Slaughter came in to see Mrs. Smith.

- Monday - 19 -

Cold - Cut wood. - Clara washed

- Tuesday - 20 -

Snowed about all day. We cut wood. - I hauled wood this afternoon - Went to the corner to night. Carroll went too.

- Wednesday - Dec. 21, 1898 -

Bushes loaded with snow. - Could not cut wood - Put a dasher on the old pump. - Clara and I went over to the corner to night.

- Thursday - 22 -

"Circle" met here today. '21 were present besides ourselves. I bought a pump of W. W. Westworth for \$5.00

- Friday - 23 -

Rained last night and this fore-noon. - Clara and I and Carroll went over to the further corner. We went down to Sarah's (Gardner's house) and got Nina. She stayed there last night. Roads bad. Mrs. Smith had a bad spell today. Clara will stay there to night.

Saturday, Dec. 24-1898-

Cut wood. This evening we all went over to Chas Owen's to a Christmas tree. All had a good time. Elias was Santa Claus. I went down to the Lodge.

Mr. Smith got a Christmas box from Lowell. - Sarah came ~~over~~ up this afternoon and will stay with her mother to-night.

Sunday - 25-

- Christmas - Lots of snow. Good shepherding in some places and some places bare; so that both wheels and runners are used.

- Monday - Dec. 26, 1898 -
Cut wood - etc.

Tuesday - 27-

- I cut and hauled wood - Mrs. Smith died at 100⁺ clock to-night after a long and tedious illness -

Mrs. Bucknam and Clara Owen were there with me. I went down and got Sarah.

Wednesday - 28 -
- Very cold -

Thursday - 29 -
Vernie came this afternoon.
