Warrant for Town Meeting

To S. U. Archer, Constable of Aurora, in the County of Hancock, State of Maine, Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Aurora, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble in town hall in said town on Monday, the 27th. day of March A. D., 1933 at one o'clock in the afternoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To see if the town will accept report as printed.
- Art. 3. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 4. To choose a chairman of the board of selectmen.
- Art. 5. To choose a second selectman.
- Art. 6. To choose a third selectman.
- Art. 7. To choose a board of assessors for the ensuing year.
- Art. 8. To choose a board of overseers of the poor for the ensuing year.
- Art. 9. To choose a board of children's guardians for the ensuing year.
- Art. 10. To see what percent the town will vote to pay for collecting taxes for the year 1933.
- Art. 11. To choose a collector of taxes for the ensuing year.
- Art. 12. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Art. 13. To choose a member of the superintending school committee for a term of three years.
- Art. 14. To choose a constable for the ensuing year.
- Art. 15. To choose a chimney inspector for the ensuing year.
- Art. 16. To choose a surveyor of wood, bark and lumber for the ensuing year.
- Art. 17. To choose a road commissioner for the ensuing year.
- Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the assessors to rescind any amounts appropriated by the town for State aid highway construction in excess of the amount required to meet State apportionment.
- Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for town charges.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for ways, highways and bridges.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for contingent fund.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for support of schools.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for repair and maintenance of cemetery.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for the superintendence account.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for public health nurse.

Art. 26. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for snow fence.

Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for poor department.

Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate and raise for repair account of schools.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to give the selectmen and treasurer authority to hire money in the name of the town, if necessary.

Art. 30. To see what sum of money the town will vote to pay for labor on town roads and state aid roads.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of \$50.00 for maintenance on third class highway.

Art. 32. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State aid as provided in Section 20, of Chapter 28, of the revised Statutes of 1930.

Art. 33. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State aid roads as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of the ways, highways and bridges, under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, of the revised Statutes of 1930 or under the provisions of Section 22, Chapter 28, of the revised Statutes of 1930.

Art. 34. To act upon any other article or articles that may come before said meeting.

School Report

Following is my annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

Miss Croquette taught the spring term and Miss Googins and Kenneth Coleman finished the year. There is one pupil attending Bangor High School. The school room needs cleaning as it has not been cleaned for two years and the windows need to be screened and a screen door purchased. Something should be done to enlarge the school room and improve the ventilation. At present it is in a very crowded condition.
