REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and the citizens of Allagash Plantation:

I herewith submit my second annual report on your schools for your consideration:

I wish to repeat my steatement of last year that your school system must be modernized and centralized if it is to efficiently and economically meet the needs of the children of Allagash. The consolidated school to be erected should be large enough to take care of all the school population, except for those in the Aaron Jackson School District. You have made a very good beginning towards raising the funds necessary to build your school. It is hoped that you will continue to add to that fund. Once that school is built and paid for, and money has to be raised only for school maintenance the burden will be considerably less.

The amount recommneded to be raised for your School Building Fund this year is quite high. Last year you had to meet a heavy deficit, so we cut your total school appropriations from \$26,020, made in 1948, to \$21,000. This year the deficit is considerably less, so we are asking for \$15,000 for the School Building, making a total school appropriation of \$26,000, approximately the same total amount as was raised two years ago. If you appropriate that amount, then we shall be in a position to look seriously into the possibility

of building this year. Various articles have been included

in the warrant to take care of this possibility.

A small school was built at Aaron Jackson's this year. Due to the distance and the condition of the road at certain seasons every year, the only logical thing to do is to maintain an Elementary School there. Hauling the children is both expensive and impractical.

ALLAGASH WARRANT-1950

Art. 1. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote to appropriate and raise for Common and High School General Accounts, including teachers, janitors and cleaning, fuel, books, supplies, conveyance and tuition.
