WARRANT

ANNUAL MARCH MEETING

To Llewellyn Damon. a constable of the Plantation of Barnard, in County of Piscataguis and State of Maine,

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Plantation of Barnard, qualified by law to vote in affairs of the Plantation, to assemble at the Schoolhouse in said Plantation, on Monday, the Twentieth day of March, A. D., 1944, at one o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following articles, namely:

- Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside over said meeting.
- Article 2. To choose a Plantation clerk for the ensuing year.
- Article 3. To see if the Plantation will vote to accept the reports of Plantation officers as printed in the annual report.
- Article 4. To choose three or more assessors for the ensuing year, and fix compensations for same.
- Article 5. To choose a Plantation treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Article 6. To choose a member of the superintending school committee to hold office three years, and fill any vacancy that may occur.

- Article 7. To see in what manner the Plantation will dispose of the collection of taxes for the ensuing year, and fix the compensation of the tax collector.
- Article 8. To choose a collector of taxes for the ensuing year.
- Article 9. To choose one or more constables for the ensuing year.
 - Article 10. To choose a Fire Ward.
- Article 11. To choose a road commissioner for the ensuing year.
- Article 12. To choose all other officers usually chosen at the regular March Meeting.
- Article 13. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for general government, i. e. officers' salaries, office supplies, elections, bonds and for miscellaneous and incidentals.
- Article 14. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote raise and appropriate for the salary of the superintendent of schools.
- Article 15. To see if the Plantation will vote to allow a discount of 2% on taxes paid on or before July 1, 1944.
- Article 16. To see if the Plantation will vote to use interest on War Bonds (\$100.00) for cemetery improvement; if not, to see what sum of money the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for same, choose a committee, and act on anything relating thereto.
- Article 17. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for ways, highways and bridges, and snow removal.

Article 18. To see if the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred five dollars (\$105.00) for maintenance of state aid and unimproved roads during the ensuing year, within limits of the Plantation, under provisions of Sections 9, 18, 37 and 38, Chapter 28 of Revised Statutes of 1930.

Article 19. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of improved sections of third class roads within the Plantation, in accordance with the provisions of Sections 44 and 46, Revised Statutes of 1930, as amended by Section 4 of Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937, and Section 1, Chapter 215 Public Laws of 1941.

Article 20. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for public health nurse.

Article 21. To see if the Plantation will vote to authorize the treasurer to deduct 25% of wages of taxpayers employed by Plantation, on their current year taxes.

The Assessors hereby give notice that they will be in session at Schoolhouse in said Plantation at twelve o'clock noon, on the day of said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL DEPARTMENT

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Barnard:

I hereby submit the annual report of the superintendent of schools.

Barnard Plantation has not maintained a school during the past year because there were not enough pupils to justify the opening of the school. There are only two pupils attending the elementary grades. These two children attend the Sebec Corner School, where they are getting along well.

At present, it does not look as if there would be a school in Barnard for a long time, to say the least. Consequently the expenditures for schools will be very small.

I suggest the following budget:

Superv	ision	\$95.00
School	Nurse	15.00
School	Committee	15.00

The cost of conveyance at the present rate will be \$180.00 per year, and the clerical service will come to \$30.00 per year. The school committee may use their judgment in regard to these appropriations and any other amounts which they wish to consider.

My work with the citizens and pupils of Barnard has not been quite as intimate during the past year because of the lack of a school; but my work has, nevertheless, been very pleasant. I wish to express my appreciation to the School, Town officials, and citizens who have been very cooperative in my work for Barnard Plantation.
