The enrollment in the school at the opening in September was: Sub. Pri. 2; Grade I, 3; Grade III, 1; Grade IV, 1.

Since the opening of school in September several opportunities for in-service training have been available and their response has been splendid. October we had the services, for a morning, of a specialist in the teaching of Reading. Also the seevices, for an evening, of the State Director of Guidance, Mr. John E. Hughes. The teacher took advantage of Visiting Day which gave her an opportunity of visiting other schools to pick up new ideas and exchange ideas with the teacher. November our present Commssioner of Education.

Harland A. Ladd, then Deputy Commissioner in Charge of Curriculum, addressed the teachers to inform them of what attempts were being made in the State of Maine to revise the curriculum and adapt it to the present day needs of our pupils. In December we had the services, for two weeks, of Miss Muriel McCallister, one of our State Elementary Supervisors. In January an all-day Institute was held in Harrington with the services of Miss McCallister. Miss Villa Hayden and Miss Zelda Gordon, three of the State Elementary Supervisors.

One of the outstanding events in the life of our school children was at the close of school in June when the Beddington and Deblois schools combined their efforts and abilities to bring a Closing Day program and pay particular honor to an eighth grade girl from each school who was leaving for high school. The interest of the parents was appreciated by the pupils more than words can express.

The enrollment of the school is small but this small enrollment gives the teacher an opportunity for individualized instruction.

Your Superintending School Committee and Teacher appreciate your support and cooperation. We are all grateful for your interest.
