

There are approximately twenty-five pupils attending school this year, in eight grades. Four of this number are in the eighth grade. It is uncertain how many of these pupils will be promoted to high school this year as the examination will not be given until the last of May. Five

tuition pupils are attending Belfast High School, two of which will graduate this year.

The Equalization Fund has been of much benefit. Besides providing four extra weeks of school there have been some excellent library and reference books purchased also a better supply of text books

A spirit of co-operation and a desire to help would not only increase the efficiency of the school but would tend to inculcate in the minds of the children a desire for right living. The public schools are for the children and should not be used for financial gain or for an opportunity to get revenge.
