# 21 Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the Town of Belmont:

I herewith submit my annual report of the progress and condition of the schools in your town.

I am pleased to report that this has been a very pleasant and profitable year for the pupiis. One can easily understand the advantages derived from co-operation and support by school officials, parents, and teachers. We wish to express our appreciation of the efforts that are being made to improve the condition of the school.

There has been an additional expense this year partly due to the fact that about fifteen pupils have moved into town since last year. This increased the expense of text books, supplies, etc. The Committee took advantage of an offer that was made to buy second-hand desks at about fifty per cent less than new ones. The desks are in excellent condition, and both seats and desks are adjustable. This is a great advantage to the children. Despite the fact that there are about forty pupils in six grades the teacher has found time to do extra work with the pupils. One thing I wish to mention is the school library. A large number of books have been added, and the pupils are taught to catalogue the books. All of the work is carried on as in large libraries. There are seven pupils attending high school. Of this number three have moved into town since the last school year.

In closing I wish to express my appreciation of the support that has been given me by the committee and citizens of the town.
