A brief summary of the Town's affairs reported so it can be understood by all.

In the past three years the Town has cut its tax rate from .087 per thousand to .057 per thousand. In July of 1942 the Town Debt was paid in full, a sum of \$3,111.50 having been paid in the past three years. \$1,317.48 of that sum was paid this year. \$2.479.76 in tax deeds carried for years as resources have been crossed from the books as worthless due to improper bounderies and failure to record at proper time. \$1,552.12 in tax liens have also been crossed from the books as worthless.

From February 4, 1942 to February 4, 1943 it cost to plow and sand the roads \$660.41, one half to be paid by the State. In the same period it cost to run our one school \$1,960.05 received from State \$563.48. Making a cost to the town of \$1,396.57.

The total amount of cash taken in in the year plus the amount left over from last year totals \$10,465.08. The total amount spent in the past year was \$7,543.96 leaving a cash balance of \$2,921.12. It has been found that the National Bank of Belfast has paid out \$38.26 in interest on Cemetery Trust Funds that never reached the town books. Through the efforts of your treasurer it will soon be collected and added to the Cemetery Trust funds where it belongs.

# Superintendent's Report

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the Town of Belmont.

The following is a brief report of the progress and condition of the Greer's Corner School. Considering the size of the school, and the many grades, the teachers have done very good work. We have been fortunate in being able to continue the school thus far without interruption. Because of the increase in teacher's salary, also the increase in the length of the school year, in this town, we hoped to share in the Equalization Fund. But many towns have increased their appropriations on account of present conditions. This has resulted in an increase of the average of tax rates for the support of schools in the State. The rate is .01402 as compared with .01301 for the preceeding year. As a result the town of Belmont will not share in the Equalization Fund, December 1943.

There are students attending Crosby High School this year. One will complete the course in June. The four students that entered high school last September have done very good work. The expense for secondary tuition is likely to increase the next few years. I would suggest that some consideration be given this matter and a reasonable sum raised to meet the expense.

I wish to thank the teachers and members of the School Committee for their co-operation and support.
