#### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the members of the superintending School Committee and Citizens of the town of Benedicta:

It is with a great deal of pleasure that I submit for your consideration my sixteenth annual report of the condition, progress and needs of your schools.

Many schools in this state have had to close this year because there were no teachers available and since the teacher shortage is expected to be worse next year the people of Benedicta should be very thankful for the efficient services of their trained and experienced teachers.

The war is bound to have its bad effects upon the schools and to keep our standards high requires the cooperation and assistance of not only the teachers and pupils but of all the people. If we can all work together for the good of the schools much better results will be obtained.

Our appropriations for the last few years in our school account have been so low and the appropriations in other towns having increased during that period has resulted in the average school rate being higher than that of Benedicta and has caused us to lose our Equalization Fund. The loss of that fund this year together with the increase in cost of running your schools necessitates increasing your appropriation this year as I have recommended in the budget.
