REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the members of the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of the town of Benedicta:

I hereby submit for your consideration my first report as Superintendent of your schools.

During my first year as your Superintendent I have endeavored to familiarize myself with your school system. After considerable investigation I am convinced that the type of education which you are offering is very good. It meets the needs of your town and compares favorably with that of other sections. You are fortunate indeed not to be hampered by the extreme teacher shortage which prevails throughout the state.

I have found the Sisters, who are teaching in your schools, most cooperative and always working for the interest of the boys and girls which they have in their care. Last fall at a meeting of the school committee it was thought advisable to increase the salary of each teacher by five dollars per week to make the amount which you are paying comparable with that paid in other schools throughout the state.

The average school rate in the state is gradually increasing.

Towns that do not keep their teachers' salaries and general school expenditures on an approximate level with those in other towns cannot be assured of a continuation of their equalization fund.

The salaries of your teachers are as follows:
