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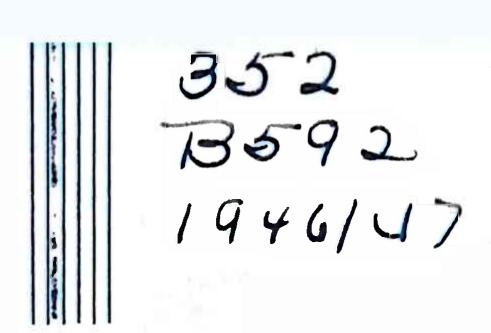

# REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Committee and Citizens of Blanchard:

I am submitting herewith my annual school report. In this report I will endeavor to summarise some important problems facing the schools of the state and provisions being considered to relieve the situation. In addition there will be found a limited report of local school conditions, together with suggestions to be considered in planning for the maintenance of a school program for another year.

The scarcity of capable teaching personnel continues a serious educational problem in our state. Even during the depression Maine was already beginning to experience a shortage of skilled and capable teachers due to declining enrollments in the normal schools and to loss of teachers to school systems in other states. During these intervening years various steps have been taken in an attempt to relieve the teacher shortage at least to the extent of making it possible for schools to remain open. Intensive recruiting campaigns have been conducted to secure the services of former teachers and to enroll promising high school graduates in our normal schools.

In order that many schools might remain open Teaching Permits have been issued to persons without the minimum training requirements for teaching, and the State Department has been compelled to issue Teaching Sanctions to persons having no formal education beyond the high school. Approximately 500 persons are now teaching in Maine on temporary teaching permits and teaching sanctions. Despite the steps taken to meet the

demand for teachers, there is little likelihood that a sufficient number of well-qualified persons will be available very soon to fill all teaching positions.

From a state-wide point of view one of the important problems facing the schools has to do with state support of public education. The last legislature increased the state school appropriations to towns and cities by a sum to make possible a minimum salary of \$1,000. This would have constituted a substantial step in the improvement of the teacher-salary situation had not inflated living costs eliminated most of the benefits thus provided. At this time it appears that costs for public schools will continue to rise, making it more urgent than ever that the State supply additional aid to towns and cities for public education.

Very likely the present legislature will make provisions for again increasing the minimum teacher-salary. We may assume that one of the resolves now before legislature will be passed in due time and estimate what additional state aid will be provided. The most promising bill at this time is the MacKinnon Bill. A preview of this bill is given below. it provides:

\$1,500 minimum salary for every certified teacher.

\$150 additional state subsidy for every certified teaching position (now \$300), plus, in towns with a school tax rate of over 12 mills, the MacKinnon Unit, guaranteed to be at least \$50 to be applied only towards certified teachers. Sanction and permit teaching positions from now on will get only \$300. No MacKinnon Unit is to be provided. One MacKinnon Unit is to be given as an extra bonus to every town for every teacher who earns 6 units in summer and/or extension courses during a given year.

Cost of benefits proposed under the MacKinnon Act has been estimated at \$1,050,000.

#### School Funds and Needs

The school budget for this annual report may be planned on the basis of paying a minimum teacher-salary of \$1,500 with the start of the school year in September. However it should be understood that paying this minimum salary will not bring about much improvement in the number of trained teachers at once. Many of these teachers are now receiving salaries in excess of \$1,500 and any that are now receiving less will be receiving increases in salaries next year. The cost of maintaining the school for next year will increase over the cost for the present year. The teacher's salary was increased for this year, and plans are being made for paying any set minimum teacher-salary for the next school year. It is expected that additional state funds will be provided to aid the town in maintaining the school program.

Only one student from the town is now attending high school. Because of a large sum now unexpended no appropriation will be necessary for high school purposes at this time. The appropriations that seem needed for other school purposes are listed elsewhere in this report.

A much larger sum was expended during the year for school repair purposes than is usually expended in any one year. As you know most of the amount used was for painting the rooms of the school building. The school officials felt that it would be better to finish the job of painting at one time rather to plan to have the painters return to finish the job some other year.

Something should be done on the outside of the building very soon. It has been suggested that some type of siding be put on the building rather than to paint it again. The siding would also serve to insulate the building, making it easier to warm the building. The cost for siding and labor for the job would probably amount to \$450. A paint job would probably cost only half of that amount.

#### COMMENTS

Re: Audit of Accounts - Town of Blanchard February 16, 1945 to February 28, 1946

#### CASH

It was ascertained that all cash recorded as received by the Treasurer had been deposited in the bank. Cash on deposit and subject to check at the close of the municipal year, plus \$71.06 in a savings account, reconciled with the cash balance as reflected by the records of the Treasurer. Expenditures were made by check and were supported by warrants authorized by the Selectmen.

#### ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE

Accounts receivable consisted of two accounts due from individuals for assistance and certain amounts due from the State and from other towns for charity cases. TAXES

The 1945 tax commitment was in agreement with the records of the Assessors. The total commitment was accounted for by cash, abatements, and discounts. There are no uncollected taxes or tax liens according to the records.

#### SURPLUS

The unappropriated surplus at February 28, 1946 amounted to \$501.99. A complete analysis of the change in surplus may be found on Exhibit E of this report. TRUST FUNDS

Trust fund investments were examined and are in the custody of the Treasurer. The record of the lots covered by the trust fund investments is not complete. GENERAL

An examination of the payrolls and paid bills on file indicated all were correctly recorded.

Te excise tax collections were verified from the collector's copies of receipts issued and the revenue was properly accounted for.

The records of the town officials were found in a satisfactory condition.

## TOWN WARRANT

# To C. M. Mitchell, a constable of the town of Blanchard, in the County of Piscataquis, GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Blanchard, qualifed by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town Hall, in said town, on Monday the 24th day of March, A. D. 1947, at one o'clock in the afternoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside over said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year and to determine his compensation.
- Art. 3. To hear all reports to be made at said meeting.
- Art. 4. To receive and act on all bills against the town.
- Art. 5. To choose three selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor for the ensuing year and to determine their compensation.
- Art. 6. To choose a town treasurer for the ensuing year and to determine his compensation.
- Art. 7. To choose one member of the school comittee for a term of three years.
- Art. 8. To choose a collector of taxes for the ensuing year and to determine his compensation.
- Art. 9. To choose a road commissioner for the ensuing year.

- Art. 10. To choose all other officers required by law to be chosen at the town meeting or to authorize the selectmen to appoint such officers.
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the elementary schools.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for secondary school purposes.
- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for free books.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for school supplies.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary of the superintendent of schools.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for school repairs.
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the service of a public health nurse.
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town charges.
- Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of poor.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for ways and bridges.
- Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Road Maintenance.

- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of highways, and bridges) under the provisions of section 25 and 29, Chap. 20, R. S. 1944 as amended.
- Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of not less than \$105.00 for the maintenance of improved section of third class roads or to be used in conjunction with state apportionment for the construction of third class roads.
- Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money under Chap. 28, R. S. 1930, as amended by Chap. 162 and 231, of P. L. of 1937, for the removal of snow from improved highways and town ways provided said roads or a portion of same are accepted as winter routes by state highway commission.
- Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of buying snow fence.
- Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$41.16 for interest on school fund.
- Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15.00 for the purpose of paying dues to the Maine Municipal Association.
- Art. 28. To see what action the town will take in regards to paying bonds for town officers.
- Art. 29. To see what discount the town will allow on

taxes paid on or before a specified date, and to see what time the collector will be required to settle in full with the town.

- Art. 30. To see what the town will do in regards to the present status of accounts receivable and now on town accounts.
- Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to hire money for town purposes in anticipation of taxes.
- Art. 32. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of both cemeteries.
- Art. 33. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the town park.
- Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to extend the present electric power lines, and to raise and appropriate fund for same.
- Art. 35. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance on town hall.
- Art. 36. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for school physician for the ensuing year.
- Art. 37. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate funds for the purpose of insuring men employed on town roads.
- Art. 38. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate funds for the purpose of surveying Blanchard-Abbott, town line.

The selectmen will be in session at the said town hall at 12:30 o'clock, P. M., of the day of said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.

Hereof fail not, and have there this warrant with your doings thereon.
