WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

To: Freemont H. Milton, constable of the Town of Burlington, in the county of Penobscot. Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Burlington qualified by law to vote in Town Affairs to assemble at the Town Hall in said Town on the 30th day of March, 1936, at One o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following articles: To Wit:—

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to Preside at said Meeting.

Article 2. To choose a Town Clerk, Selectmen, Town Treasurer, and all other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To see what sums of money the town will raise for the Support of Schools, High School Tuition, Text Books and Supplies, Repairs of School Buildings, Road Patrol, Interest Account and Town Debt, Town Charges, Support of Poor.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$600. for the Repairs of Roads and Bridges to be expended as specified including 50-50 account.

To see what sum the town will appropriate for State Aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways, and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 173, Public Laws of 1935.

Article 6. To see what sum, if any, the town will recommend to take from the joint state aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to state aid roads, in excess of the requirements of Section 2, Chapter 132, P. L. 1935.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$60.00 for the Maintenance of Third Class Highway to entitle the Town to Third Class Road.

Article 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Improvement of Town Cemetery.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to build an Outhouse at the Town Hall.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to buy a Snow Plow for use on Trucks.

Article 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Abatement Account.

Article 16. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the collection of Taxes for the year ensuing.

Article 17. To see if the sum of \$25.00, or more, will be raised for School Nursing in the town of Burlington under the auspices of the Bureau of Health of The State Department of Health and Welfare.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote not to pay any wages except at the discretion of the Selectmen for Town Labor until taxes are paid.

Article 19. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to renting the Town Hall.

Article 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen give notice that they shall be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at Twelve o'clock Noon on the day of said meeting.
