



Although it is the custom for the superintendent; on closing the business for the year to make a few remarks; will endeavor to make these brief. This is because I do not believe in making extended remarks on what has been done by yourself or others.

As to the schools; I think they are, as a whole, in a very good condition. And I see no reason why, if you follow the policy of getting reliable teachers; even if you pay them a little more; our schools cannot be sustained on a good standard. In the fall and winter terms especially the winter we had some trouble in a shortage of books. This was due to the fact that quite an amount of new books were burned; and as we did not see our way clear to buy anything we could get along without we experienced some inconveniences

In conclusion will say; that I hope it will not be long before the town can see its way clear to have a little longer school year. And that there may be a change in the method in the village proper, and have a graded school. I also wish to thank the school committee for the privleges I have had, and the way they have used me while under them.
