SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT LEAGUE OF MAINE.

We have branches of the School Improvement League of Maine in six schools and herewith give something of a report of what each league has been doing the past year.

WINNECOOK SCHOOL LEAGUE.

The league has purchased a Webster's Unabridged Dictionary and have papered the school room and whitened the ceiling. They have given one entertainment during the year and received from that \$6.48. The amount in the treasury at present is \$5.22.

MISS AGNES WHITTEN, Treasurer.

HAWTHORNE SCHOOL LEAGUE.

The Hawthorne League of the Dodge School held a lawn party at the close of the spring term and received nine dollars. At the close of the fall term an entertainment was given by the school and three dollars received. Seven dollars has been spent in improving the walls and ceiling. Amount in treasury at close of year, \$5.45.

MISS HAZEL CHANDLER, Treasurer.

LINCOLN LEAGUE.

During the spring term some necessary articles for the school room were purchased. In the fall an entertainment and box social was given and \$5.50 received. During the winter the children sold tickets issued by the Educational Pub. Co. for the purpose of purchasing a library. Amount in treasury at close of year \$2.20.

BOYCE HUNT, Treasurer.

MOUNT SCHOOL LEAGUE.

This school has done little active work in the league excepting during the spring term when a new large dictionary was purchased. Amount in treasury at close of year, about \$1.50.

LEON TILTON, Treasurer.

VILLAGE, No. 5.

The S. I. L. M. of District No. 5 in union with District No. 10 raised during the year \$25.79 which was used to maintain a music teacher and furnish material for teaching music in this school. Amount in treasury at close of year, \$1.00.

HAROLD HUBBARD, Treasurer.

VILLAGE No. 10.

The S. I. L. M. of District No. 10 began the school year with \$14.79 in the treasury. This amount together with \$25.79 received from an ice cream sale in the spring and an entertainment and supper given by the joint leagues in Districts No. 5 and 10, in the fall term was used to pay for music in the school, leaving \$3.05 at the close of the winter term.

TEACHERS.

During the past year, we have employed fourteen different teachers. Our teachers as a whole have been efficient and painstaking. Four teachers hold state certificates for teaching, two are Normal School graduates, four are graduates of M. C. I. and each of the others has attended or graduated from some standard school.

COMMON SCHOOLS.

We have maintained eight schools during the year of twentynine weeks each, with the exception of the Mount and Elweir schools, which were allowed longer terms in the spring and fall on account of these schools being shortened last year, due to sickness.

Seven pupils completed the course of study at the close of the year's work in June, and were awarded diplomas of graduation.

REPAIRS.

A new closet has been built at Reynolds Corner.

The school house at No. 10 has been newly shingled.

Some work in the way of repairs has been done to the majority of the school houses.

BOOKS.

We have exchanged the geographics which have been in use for Frye's Grammar School and Frye's Elementary Geographies. We have introduced a civil government for use in the schools using Reinsch's Young Citizen's Reader.

I recommend that some change be made in the readers during the coming year.

In conclusion I wish to say that I appreciate the consideration extended to me throughout the year.
