#### To the Superintending School Committee:

Gentlemen:—I have the honor at this time to submit for your consideration and approval, my second annual report on the condition and progress of the public schools of this town. There will be found in another part of this volume, statistical tables showing in detail, expenditures for the last year, and other school date.

In making a report upon the condition and progress of popular education in Burnham for the past year, the question, "What is being done in our schools" is a matter of the greatest possible interest to parents and citizens as well as to those connected officially with our school system.

The question of quality of education, however, cannot be answered with the same precision as questions of enrollment, attendance and cost, for educational science has not reached a stage in its development where it may be applied with accuracy to work in our schools.

What I have to report, therefore, is based not upon scientific measurement, but upon careful observation through many personal visits to the elementary school classes. The following conclusions, then, will have value in proportion to public confidence in the one making the observations, and his skill in drawing conclusions.

For the schools as a whole, the last year has been one of reasonable progress, both in effort on the part of teachers and pupils and actual work accomplished. I am convinced that our present school system is much better than it was a year ago and that we are slowly approaching the standard that we would have. It must be continually borne in mind that we shall continue to have only an ordinary school system just so long as the people as a whole feel that the present schools are good enough, and that there is no need of a greater

expenditure in bringing the standard of the schools to a point where they may compare favorably with schools in other towns.

We must understand the facts as they actually are and be willing to do all we can to bring about more satisfactory results throughout the town.

The school committee and superintendent have made several efforts to bring about better school conditions, only to be defeated by a vote of the town at regular or special town meetings.

An effort was made to consolidate the Winnecook and Reynold's Corner Schools with but one motive in mind, namely, to bring to the pupils who were attending the Winnecook School, better conditions under which to work, surrounded with better apparatus and under the influences of better teachers. We were defeated by a vote of the citizens. Just so long as the citizens prefer to follow the advice of those who feel called upon to oppose the recommendations of the school committee, just so long will the efforts of a committee for better schools result in no rapid strides toward the goal of their effort.

However, the teachers, working in harmony with the school committee, and superintendent have made strong efforts to make their schools better from day to day and have accomplished a great amount of good work during the last year.

All schools have been supplied with modern text-books during the last year so we can now say that we have a uniform system of text-books throughout the entire school system.

We are fortunate in having at least one modern and up-to-date school building in town. The Reynold's Corner school is one where the pupils are able to enjoy school life from day to day surrounded by the influences of a good building, with a good basement in which to play during the recreation period of the stormy winter days. The people in this community are keenly interested in their school and do much to promote its success in many ways.

It is hoped that the citizens of the town, will, within a few years, see the necessity of building a similar one in the village.

#### REPAIRS

During the last fiscal year more or less repairs have been made on the school property throughout the town. Of the repairs, the most extensive were made at the Winnecook School where a new ceiling has been placed and the walls papered. At the Reynold's Corner school, outside of refinishing some of the desks and a part of the wood work, very little repair work has been done.

Shingles have been bought to be placed on the roof of the Dodge school. At thde Eelweir school, several minor repairs have been made. The Village school has been papered and the ceiling whitened.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

I am convinced that the policy in regard to repairs, should be one whereby the money expended may result in permanent improvement to the school property. If it is the intention of the town not to erecet a new school building in the village within a few years, at least \$200 or \$300 should be expended on the old village school in order to make it at least presentable, to those who may be called upon to look at it, and in addition to this, make it a healthy place in which to work. As it is now, it is hardly a fitting place for the child to spend six hours out of the twenty-four of each school day. A school building should be made attractive to the child, a place to be admired not loathed.

At Reynold's Corner we have an excellent building. and we should keep this property in the best possible condition at all times. The outer walls of this building should be stained and the trimmings painted. inside walls should be tinted also the ceiling, the wood work should be refinished, the floor oiled, and black boards installed. At the Dodge school the walls and ceiling should be tinted and a new floor laid, individual seats provided, a new stove, and two chairs bought. The roof also needs attention. At the Mount school. the building should be painted on the outside, the outhouse repaired, and several minor matters improved. At the Eelweir school, a new floor should be laid, new black boards and individual seats provided, the outhouse here needs attention. While the Winnecook school house is in very much better condition than it has been for some time, yet there are several matters here that should be attended to. A desk should be provided for the teacher, chairs for teacher and visitors. also individual seats for the pupils.

The school union of Clinton, Canaan & Burnham will be broken up some time between now and next July, Burnham going into the union of Albion, Troy, Unity and Unity Plantation. Pittsfield is to take Burnham's place in the union of Clinton, Canaan and Burnham.

I wish to take the opportunity at this time to express my appreciation of the support given me by the school committee members during my two years of service in this town, also to the town officials for their many favors.
