

Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To choose three selectmen for the ensuing year.

Art. 4. To choose assessors and overseers of the poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To choose a road commissioner for the ensuing year.

Art. 6. To choose a member of the school board for the term of three years; one for one year.

Art. 7. To choose a town treasurer for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for support of schools.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for high schools for the ensuing year.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for text books.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repair of school property.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for school supplies.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay superintendent of schools.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay school board.

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for support of poor for the ensuing year.

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay town charges for the ensuing year.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for roads and bridges for the ensuing year.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay snow bills for the ensuing year.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay on town debt.

Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay interest.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for street lights for the ensuing year.

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote for abatement for the ensuing year.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay the town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the care of its cemeteries under the direction of the selectmen.

Art. 26. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise for advertising the resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.

Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State patrol maintenance.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in section 19, chapter 25 of the Public Laws of 1916.

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of \$533.00 or more for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined by the State Highway Commission under section 18, chapter 25, of Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote and raise money to pay discount on taxes paid in, on or before July 1st, 1927, and if so, how much; also to charge interest after Jan. 1st, 1928, if so how much.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote and authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to hire money for the use of the town, if necessary, for the ensuing year.

Art. 32. To see what method the town will vote and take relative to the collection of taxes for the ensuing year.

Art. 33. To see if the town will vote that all tax payers owing a tax, doing work for the town, must fix up their taxes before they receive any money for their labor.

Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to exempt the Maine Chair Factory for 1927 tax.

Art. 35. To see what action the town will take in relation to the Town Hall.

Art. 36. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs of improved road for the ensuing year.

Art. 37. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for insurance on school property.

Art. 38. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for medical inspection of schools.

Art. 39. To see if the town will authorize the superintending school committee to maintain a school at the Pond, the Dodge or the Eelweir districts, if they consider it to be for the best interest of all.

Art. 40. To see if the town will vote to abate Mr. C. W. Vincent's taxes for the year 1926.

Art. 41. To see if the town will vote to raise \$500.00 for gravel to be expended on the Mount road, beginning at T. A. McAllister's.

Art. 42. To see if the town will vote to repair the driveway of Bert E. Braley, beginning at the main road and extending about two hundred feet in the direction of his residence.

Art. 43. To see if the town will vote to join the towns of Waldo County with a Poor Farm Association, for the purpose of leasing and maintaining an association almshouse, provided satisfactory arrangements can be made.

Art. 44. To see if the town will vote to buy an adding machine for the town office.

Art. 45. To see if the town will vote to buy a fire engine for the use of the town, if so to make arrangements to pay for same.



Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens
of Burnham:

Another fiscal school year has passed and in compliance with the school laws and custom, I submit to you this my second annual report of your schools.

Your teachers were all present at a meeting held at Albion the Saturday before schools began. I had as speakers, Supt. Harold Clifford, Boothbay Harbor; Supt. F. D. Rowe, Warren; Mr. Ross, representative of Ginn & Co.; and Miss Buck of the Health Crusade.

The teachers for the spring term were as last reported, with the addition of Mrs. Doe at the Mount, Mr. Marshall returning to Reynolds' Corner.

The Fall term opened with Miss Ruth Mudgett at the Village Grammar and Miss Doris McKenney at the Mount.

All the schools have made good progress. Favorable comments could be made of all teachers. You have a corps deeply interested in their work who are striving to do their best for the individual pupil.

The discipline in the school room is all that can be desired and the outside conduct has improved.

Some damage has been done to school property at the Village school. These acts, save one, were done outside of school hours before the arrival of the teacher.

I regret that there is a person or a student who injures property and is afraid to admit it. Accidents

are apt to occur, and if they do one should have moral courage enough to come forward. If one continues without admitting a wrong his conscience becomes stupified and will be led to commit a criminal act.

When you discover yourself tempted to do that which is wrong you should check it at once.

There are parents who are anxious for their children to do good school work, but by having a little grain of prejudice, place a handicap on them.

The teacher alone cannot have a first class school. We must be all of one spirit, and that of one eager to learn. Schools are not to be trifled with, but supported. Ours is a sacred calling whether it be teacher or parent.

Following I give a few suggestions:

Don't discuss the teacher in the presence of your children.

Don't criticize the teacher or school to other people.

Don't forget that the teacher of your child has to deal with and control others each day. You find it hard with one or two.

I believe a Parent-Teachers' Association would be a good organization for your town. I would be pleased to meet at the school room for this purpose. You are invited to write to Mrs. J. D. Small, Westbrook, Me., who will acquaint you with the work of this organization.

Books

New text books in English have been placed in the schools this year. The schools are very well supplied with books. The life of a book is not often more than four years so it requires some each year to replace them.

I have added quite a few readers as a child of each grade should read three or four books.

Conveyance

Your committee deemed it best to discontinue the practice of sending a part of their pupils to Troy, as they could be conveyed to a school in town.

This did not meet with the approval of part of the people.

In order to overcome this trouble it seems best to open the Dodge school this Spring term. It would not cost much more, if any, to maintain the school.

Repairs

The toilets at Reynolds Corner have been connected with the building. I believe all are well satisfied with the arrangement and work.

A few repairs will be needed before opening the Dodge school.

Medical Inspection

Dr. Whitney of Unity was engaged as medical inspector. He has made three trips to the schools, but was unable to finish with them this fall because of business. He made plans but would be called away.

I believe some good has come from his inspection.

Parents who have children with skin disease could overcome the trouble by following it up closely. Do not be satisfied if it ceases to show, but continue treatment for a long time.

Resignation

I regret to report the resignation of Mrs. Sherman as a member of the School Committee.

She is one who has the interest of her town at heart and has worked for the good of the schools. She gives as her reason for resigning that she has not the time to devote to it, but somehow, I feel that she was somewhat discouraged.
