Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens
of Burnham:

We have come to the end of another fiscal year and according to custom and the law of our state we are called to account for our stewardship. It gives me pleasure to report on your schools.

The work in the school room has been a decided success this year. The pupils have made a marked improvement, not only in scholarship but in conduct as well.

You will recall that in my first report I gave you the seven chief objectives to be accomplished in the development and intellectual growth of a pupil.

The seventh, "the use of leisure" seldom enters the mind of the average person but today it ranks on a par with "knowledge of the fundamental processes." The school is for the purpose of fitting a child for true citizenship, and this requires more than the daily routine of book knowledge. The rural schools of today are handicapped because of the lack of equipment to employ the child's leisure time.

EXPENSES

There are two places where our expense account has been large, namely, common school tuitions, and transportation.

The back tuition of \$166.00 to Clinton was not paid until this year and unavoidable conditions made the conveyance bill large.

Because of the fact that so much has been said

about conveyance I feel that I should report in detail.

Your committee has started as a basis in determining transportation that no one child shall cost more than \$3.00 per week.

We have three costing \$3.00 each, namely: Mr. Laforest Hathorn, Mr. Harold Edmonds, and Mr. Truman Whitten. They each have one child.

Mrs. Lena Cookson conveys a distance of two miles or more. At the beginning of the year she received pay for four children, taking two others free gratis. One family at about Christmas vacation moved away. She received \$8.00 per week.

Mr. Lasselle conveys a distance of three miles or more going from his home out to Mr. Young's where he takes on three, and passing Mr. Wm. Lasselle's takes on his child free gratis making five in all.

Mrs. Pease conveys a distance of 3 1-2 miles conveying six pupils who live two miles or more from the schoolhouse: Shakespeare, 2; Thurston, 1; McDonald, 2; Goodrich, 1, and the three Huff children free gratis. The McDonalds moved away during the Christmas vacation.

Fred Reynolds has seven children living more than five miles from the schoolhouse. We pay him \$7.50 per week the same as he had at the start with only two children. We pay Clinton \$7.00 per week for tuition, making in all for his seven a total of fourteen dollars and fifty cents.

Your committee has tried to get this done for less and here is a job for any party who can and will do it for less. If you wish it please come forward.

A new family came into town last May with a family of three or four children, one a cripple. They located near the Clinton town line. Conveyance was necessary.

Conditions have changed so that it may be possible to combine the two conveyances to Reynolds corner.

There seems to be no criticism on the conveyance from Winnecook.

A conveyance fee of three dollars was allowed Mr. Chase. His children are small and have to pass through a piece of woods.

REPAIRS

A new wood furnace that takes a cordwood stick has been installed in the village school. We have found no trouble in heating the room this winter and have not used more than half the fuel required with the old furnace.

Only a small amount will be necessary to raise for repairs.

There is plenty fuel in the basement for more than another year. This fuel bill has been paid.

The fuel, conveyance, and common tuition bills will be three hundred dollars or more less than this present year. With this reduction in current expenses you should nearly approach a school year of thirty-six weeks.

BOOKS

Your schools are very well supplied with books.

No change in text has been made, and none seems necessary. Only new books to take the place of those worn out. The supplementary reading material is always welcome.

We have laid particular stress on reading, and feel that much has been accomplished.

Citizens of the old school, who are not in direct touch with the schools of today, question the educational achievements of the pupils.

This is not a question of debate or for argument, but I feel quite certain that I can produce boys and girls ranging in years from thirteen to fourteen who can pass an educational test equal to that of their critics. I would be pleased to conduct such a test.

The old schools were good, they produced men and women of true worth and ability. I have no fear but what a similar proportion will come from the schools of today.

ATTENDANCE

The attendance has been exceptionally good. Had it not been for one family in the primary and grammar school we would have had a school year of almost perfect attendance. The enrollment remains the same as last year.

In conclusion I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the loyal citizens for their liberal support of the school, to the teachers my most cordial thanks for their cooperation and faithful service and to you of the committee my sincere gratitude for your support.
