

### TEACHERS' RETIREMENT FUND

I wish to call your attention to the "Teachers' Retirement Act" which came into effect this year. To those eligible for this the sum of 5 per cent is deducted each pay day and held in reserve until the end of the year when a check for the full amount is drawn and sent to the State Treasurer. He deposits a like amount for each teacher which draws interest at four per cent computed quarterly.

This takes the place of the old pension act and will be found to be much better for the teacher who remains in service until sixty years of age and a real savings for the teacher of ten or fifteen years' service.

#### SCHOOL FUNDS

It is impossible for this town to have 36 weeks of school on any less than \$5300 for its annual appropriation, and this coming year I recommend \$5500. You will note that your high school tuition is \$400 more than last year and it will be even more the next.

Your committee have done their best with this

troublesome problem of conveyance, you will note that it is about the same as in the past.

I will give you a few towns for comparison in relation to the amount of school money raised and amount paid teachers.

Your committee had both the Village and Reynolds Corner school buildings painted and stained on the exterior. Next year they purpose to clean the walls and ceiling of all the schools and if possible give them a coat of calcimine.

In conclusion I wish to thank the citizens for their liberal support of the schools, the committee for their loyalty, the teachers for their efficient work my words of commendation, and to the school children for their striving for mastery, I am pleased to be your school superintendent.
