Town Warrant

- Art. 1 To choose a moderator.
- Art. 2. To choose a town clerk.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will accept the reports as submitted by the several town officers.
- Art. 4. To choose selectmen, assessors and overseers of poor, town treasurer, road commissioner, one or more members of the school board, and any other necessary town officers.
- Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for support of schools.
- Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for repair of school property.
- Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for salary of superintendent of schools.
- Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay school board.
- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for support of poor.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for town charges.
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay interest.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay on town debt.

- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for abatement of taxes.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for street lights, school lights and Town Hall.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for highways and bridges.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for snow bills.
- Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on all taxes paid on or before July 1, 1932, and if so, to raise money for the same, and fix the amount of allowance.
- Art. 18. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of \$25 for health nursing, under the auspices of the State Health Dept.
- Art. 19. To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Section 19, Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- Art. 20. - Art. 23. To see if the town will vote and raise money for maintenance of State Highway, if so, how much.
- Art. 24. To see if the town will vote and raise money for maintenance of Third Class highway, and if so, how much.
- Art. 25. To see if the town will vote and raise money for cutting bushes, improved highway.
- Art. 26. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for insurance.
- Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to be expended in cemeteries.
- Art. 28. To see what method the town will vote and take relative to the collection of taxes for the ensuing year.
- Art. 29. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of \$310.05 to pay for expenses for diphtheria epidemic.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.
- Art. 31. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for town officers' bills.



While it cost the town a considerable amount yet had it not been for the skillful manner in which your health commission handled it the cost would have been greater and too, more deaths.

Let us here pause in memory of those who, as flowers, passed to the school celestial.

ACTION OF COMMITTEE

At the beginning of the school year it was voted to have nine grades in our school system. This will give your pupils a better preparation thus enabling them the better to take up advanced work.

All your children at the present are young for entering high school thus this act will be of material benefit.

Soon, most any day now, I expect to receive the tuition bill from M. C. I. which I judge will be for 21 pupils at \$35., or \$735.00; and again in June for 19 pupils at \$25., or \$475.00. Next fall term may be 17 pupils at \$40., or \$680.00, making a total of \$1,890.00 to M. C. I. You will also have two at Unity at \$60. each or \$120.00, and one each at Clinton, Newport and Bingham which will amount to \$140.00. There will be a pupil to enter Oak Grove where the tuition is \$100. per year and a year's tuition of \$32. to Troy. Thus you will see that tuition will be as much next year as this.

This is a year when we must give special attention to our appropriations in every department of town affairs.

When your teachers were elected for the present school year it was with a cut of twenty percent, or from twenty to sixteen dollars per week.

I met with your special budget committee and gave recommendations as low as I felt they should be, but they were reduced.

I doubt very much if we can maintain the efficiency of our schools with that amount.

SPECIAL

All school bills which are due have passed to your selectmen for a town order, but I anticipate as last year, that a part of them will not go to the treasurer for payment, as the town funds are low.

Whenever I draw a school order for any amount that shows on my books as being deducted from the school money—I have nothing to do with cash or check payment.

It is not altogether right for school orders to remain unpaid when the school funds are not exhausted. I fully understand the financial condition of the town, but trust that very soon this will be corrected.

In closing I wish to express to all, the citizens, committee, teachers and pupils, my hearty appreciation for your co-operation.
