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

Town Warrant

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator.
- Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the reports as submitted by the several town officers.
- Art. 4. To choose three selectmen, assessors, and overseers of the poor for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to elect a road commissioner, and if so, to elect one.
- Art. 6. To choose a town treasurer, member or members of the school board and all necessary town officers.
- Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the support of school. (Recommend \$4,000.00).
- Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the repair of school property. (Recommend \$75.)
- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for salary of school board. (Recommend \$30.)
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay town officers' salaries. (Recommend \$800.)
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for support of poor. (Recommend \$2,500.)
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for town charges. (Recommend \$500.)
- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay on town debt. (Recommend \$2,000.)
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay interest. (Recommend \$1100.)
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for abatement and discount. (Recommend \$600.)

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for repair of highways and bridges. (Recommend \$500.)

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for snow removal. (Recommend \$1,150.)

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for maintenance of State, State Aid and Third Class Road. (Recommend \$860.50): (State Road, \$247.; State Aid, \$256.50; 3rd Class, \$357.00)

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for removal of bushes on improved roads. (Recommend \$100.)

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Sec. 20, Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of Maine.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of \$533.00 for the improvement of the Section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the Highway Commission, in addition to the amount already raised for the care of ways and highways, the above amount being the maximum amount which the town is allowed to raise under the provisions of Section 18, Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of Maine.

Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for insurance of town property. (Recommend \$250.)

Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for care of cemeteries. (Recommend \$25.00)

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote and raise \$25.00 to care for uncared for lots in the Village cemetery.

Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for street lights for the ensuing year.

Art. 26. To see if the sum of \$25.00 or more will be raised for school nursing.

Art. 27. To see what method the town will adopt for collection of taxes for the ensuing year.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid on or before July 1st. (Recommend 5%)

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to make temporary loans for the town to be paid during the current year by taxes and the selectmen to issue notes for and in the name of the town for the loans made.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to deduct 50% on all town orders issued for labor or material to those owing the town for taxes, to be credited on taxes.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of \$250.00 to pay the overdrawn 1935 account.

Art. 32. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for P. W. A., to be used for the purchase of material and labor not supplied by P. W. A. funds. (\$500. recommended)

Art. 33. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of
Burnham:

This, my eleventh annual report of your schools will be brief as I have no special suggestion to make or comments to offer.

It is difficult to have an efficiency of 100%, nevertheless it seems to me that your schools are in a very satisfactory condition.

We have an excellent corps of teachers, each efficient and loyal to his trust.

The E. S. N. School at Castine has an exchange plan whereby they give one of our teachers an opportunity to have six weeks' training, sending to her school a trained teacher to get experience.

Mrs. Dorothy Reynolds availed herself of the opportunity, and they sent Miss Alice Huff to her school.

Since making the exchange I visit the school three times and report my findings to the Principal of Castine Normal, the school, too, is visited by Miss Bills, the critic teacher at Castine, also by Mr. Scott, the vice-principal.

This is proving very profitable for all and I trust that the committee will continue the plan.

H. S. STUDENTS

I am receiving excellent reports from the principals of the various schools where we have students.

We are paying a large tuition yet it is very doubtful we could maintain a school of either an "A" or "B" grade for less.

At the present time we do not receive from the state any more for tuition than the town that pays \$1050.00.

There is already a bill prepared for the next legislature which will ask the state to reimburse at the rate of 2-3 for any amount. This will be helpful to you, and I trust that you will give aid in bringing it about. I shall not be your superintendent at that time but shall have my interest with you.

SCHOOL FUNDS

I am aware of the fact that these are hard times and we should curtail expenses as far as possible but I trust that you will provide enough money to run your school on the present schedule, which is very low.

This is the picture. We can discard the \$332.20, which appears in our funds this year as it came from the overlay, and we thank our selectmen for allowing it.

You will note that last year there was unexpended \$596.72 and this year \$97.55, a difference of approximately \$500. This means that an additional amount of \$500.00 should be raised. It is very doubtful if we have an equalization to apply to next year's funds. If you raise \$4,000.00 that should give you \$200.00 or more for the next year in equalization.

CONCLUSION

At my last election I told the joint committee that I would not be a candidate for re-election as I wished to retire, or at least take a year's vacation after July 1, '37, and I so notify the public in order that candidates be free to solicit the position.

I wish to thank the citizens, committee and teachers for their loyalty and good support given their schools.
