Town Warrant

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator.
- Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the reports as submitted by the several town officers.
- Art. 4. To choose three selectmen, assessors, and overseers of the poor for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to elect a road commissioner, and if so, to elect one.
- Art. 6. To choose a town treasurer, member or members of the school board and all necessary town officers.
- Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for support of schools.
- Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the repair of school property.
- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for salary of school board.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay town officers' salaries. (Recommend \$800.00).
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for support of poor. (Recommend \$1,000.00).
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for town charges. (Recommend \$300.00).
- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay on town debt. (Recommend \$750.00).
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise to pay interest. (Recommend \$1,100.00).
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for abatement and discount. (Recommend \$300.00).
 - Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote

and raise for repair of highways and bridges. (Recommend \$250.00).

- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the maintenance of State, State Aid and Third Class roads. (Recommend \$888.57: State Road, \$247.00; State Aid Road, \$250.00; Third Class, \$391.57).
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for snow removal. (Recommend \$1,150.00).
- Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for removal of bushes on improved roads. (Recommend \$110.00).
- Art. 20. To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Section 20, Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of Maine.
- Art. 21. To see what sum the town will appropriate for State Aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 173, Public Laws of 1935.
- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for insurance of town property. (Recommend \$250.00).
- Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the care of cemeteries.
- Art. 24. To see what sum the town will vote and raise for street lights for the ensuing year. (Recommend \$216.00).
- Art. 25. To see if the sum of \$25.00 or more will be raised for school nursing.
- Art. 26. To see what method the town will adopt for the collection of taxes for the ensuing year.
- Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to abate the unpaid 1936 tax of the F. A. McAllister Heirs.
- Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid on or before July 1st. (Recommend 5%).

- Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to make temporary loans for the town to be paid during the current year by taxes and the selectmen to issue notes for and in the name of the town for the loans made.
- Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to deduct 50% on all town orders issued for labor or material to those owing the town for taxes, to be credited on taxes.
- Art. 31. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for W. P. A. to be used for the purchase of material and labor not supplied by W. P. A. funds. (Recommend \$1,000.00).
- Art. 32. To see what action the town will take, if any, in regard to letting the town hall for the ensuing year.
- Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to authorize the town treasurer to execute for and in behalf of the town a warranty deed conveying to George E. Reynolds, the Fred L. Reynolds homestead farm containing 25 acres and his woodlot and pasture containing 150 acres, being all the land in said Burnham assessed to said Fred L. Reynolds, said town's title to the same having been acquired by unredeemed tax liens, for the payment by said George E. Reynolds the sum of \$600.00, or take any action in relation thereto.
- Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to authorize the town treasurer to execute for and in behalf of the town a deed releasing the town's interest in those lots of real estate on which the town has acquired an interest by enforcement of tax liens, when the tax on such lots is paid.
- Art. 35. To see if the town will vote and authorize the selectmen to take such action as they may deem proper in regard to the sale of those lots of real estate on which the town has acquired an interest by enforcement of tax liens providing they receive the amount of the unpaid taxes or more; and authorize the town treasurer to execute for and in behalf of the town a deed releasing the town's interest in such lots, or take any action in relation thereto.
- Art. 36. To see if the town will vote to discontinue any or all of the Perkins road, so called, or take any action in relation thereto.
- Art. 37. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Burnham:

Another fiscal year has passed and it becomes my duty to make this my twelfth and last report of your schools.

Two weeks after schools began Mr. Hunt resigned as Principal of the Reynolds Corner School when Miss Carolyn Pressey was secured to take the position which she held until her resignation when Mrs. Ward took over the work. In spite of the changes this school has done excellent work showing marked improvement.

We were sorry to have the resignation of Mrs. Agnes Woods, Principal of the Village school, yet fortunate in the selection of Mrs. Reynolds, who has carried on the work very successfully.

Mrs. Florice Davis, elected to teach the Eelweir, remained only two weeks when she resigned to accept a better position in Pittsfield, and again good fortune was with us in securing the services of Mrs. Edythe Libby of Hartland. Mrs. Frances Cookson, before beginning her work at the Mount school, took a course of nine weeks at Castine Normal School, this being made possible by Mrs. McNelly substituting for her.

Our two primary teachers, Mrs. Cora Braley and Alice Woods, continue with their good work in their respective positions. Your schools are all that one might expect if not desired. You have a force of teachers who are working effectively in their schools having a group of children who wish to respond.

The noon lunch in your schools is enjoyed by the children since it is served under the supervision of the teacher; a few schools serve a warm dish, all have a near approach to table etiquette. Miss Hayden, who visited our schools giving the teachers assistance in teaching music, complimented us on the orderly conduct of the children during the noon lunch, especially the village school where both teachers meet with their scholars in the Primary room. The children in their seats with their lunch before them are led in grace by their teacher. Not only for their orderly conduct of the noon lunch did she compliment the schools, but each for the manner in which they received her and for their enthusiasm in taking up the work she presented.

HIGH SCHOOL TUITION

The payment of high school tuition has been the hardest bill for town officials to pay especially through these hard times and truly I can see why this is. It almost seems like paying out money receiving nothing in return, but this should not be. You should look upon it as payment of high school teachers if you had such to maintain, and you must know that you could not maintain a high school for the money you are paying for tuition.

Your tuition bills are paid up to the close of the school year July 1, '36. There is a small bill from Belfast that I have questioned on the ground that they charged in excess of their legal tuition.

I have on my file a bill from M. C. I. for the Fall term of '36 and Winter of '36-'37 and because these are not paid they are charging interest. The first year the new law takes effect you should clean these up to date which would mean paying tuition for a year and half. By so doing you could then meet them regularly thereafter. When I came here I found several tuition bills undrawn. I shall leave with all drawn up to date

but my successor will not be able to draw any more until a year from that time.

One phase of the new school law provides that the state reimburse a town to the extent of one half the conveyance and tuition whereas to-day there is nothing for conveyance and only \$700.00 for tuition.

You will note from the school enrollment that this year you have a large class to graduate but afterward they become smaller which will mean less tuition after two years.

Recommendations

Next year your tuition will be a little more, and as there is not much unexpended I would recommend that you raise for schools \$3,700.00, and \$50.00 for repairs.

You are now raising 13 mills school money on your valuation but if the school bill passes the legislature you nor any town will be expected to raise more than 11 mills and receive from the state double the amount you now receive.

Conclusion

In taking my leave as your superintendent, I wish to again express my gratitude for the many cordial receptions you have given me and for the support you have given your schools through these last few years of hard times. Now that conditions are returning to normal and feeling that this legislature will enact an equalization law which will be much more liberal and may it be in the true sense a law that does equalize the school burden you will I know take full advantage of it giving your teachers full benefit.

To the pupils, I assure you that my love for you will never weaken, and I shall look forward following you in school work. Aim to be of true service in life and you will attain the goal.

Teachers, it is not at all easy to step down from the work to which my life has been dedicated, and break the many pleasant relations that has been mine to enjoy through contact of those of our profession. You have been loyal and faithful to your trust. May you go on in the same pleasant manner with my successor.

To you members of the committee, I wish to express my sincere thanks for the unquestionable support you have given not only by your vote but for your voice in upholding my integrity. I trust that my successor will enjoy with you this same pleasant relation that has been mine.
