Town Warrant

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator.
- Art. 2. To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the reports as submitted by the several town officers.
- Art. 4. To choose three selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to elect a road commissioner and if so, to elect one.
- Art. 6. To choose a town treasurer, member or member's of the school board and all necessary town officers.
- Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for support of schools.
- Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for repair of school property.
- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for salary of school board.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for officers' salaries. (Recommend \$800.)
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for support of poor. (Recommend \$1,000.)
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for town charges. (Recommend \$300.)
- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for payment of town debt. (Recommend \$500.)
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for payment of interest. (Recommend \$1,100.)
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for abatement and discount of taxes. (Recommend \$300.)



- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for repair of highways and bridges. (Recommend \$250.)
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the maintenance of State, State Aid, and Third Class roads. (Recommend \$920); (State road, \$247; State Aid Road, \$250; Third class road, \$423; Total \$920.)
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for snow removal. (Recommend \$1,250).
- Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for removal of bushes on improved roads. (Recommend \$110.)
- Art. 20. To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Section 20, Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of Maine.
- Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will appropriate for State Aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930 or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937. (Recommend \$799.50.)
- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for insurance of town property. (Recommend \$250).
- Art. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for care of cemeteries.
- Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for street lights for the ensuing year.
- Art. 25. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of Twenty-five dollars for school nursing.
- Art. 26. To see what method the town will adopt for the collection of taxes for the ensuing year.
- Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise, to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.

- Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid on or before July 1st. (Recommend 5%.)
- Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to make temporary loans for the town to be paid during the current year by taxes and the selectmen to issue notes for, and in, the name of the town for the loans made and to issue bonds when necessary.
- Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to deduct 50% on all vouchers issued for labor or material to those owing taxes, to be credited on taxes.
- Art. 31. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for W. P. A., to be used for the purchase of material and labor not supplied by W. P. A. funds. (Recommend \$500.)
- Art. 32. To see what action the town will take in regard to letting the town hall for the ensuing year.
- Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to abate the unpaid taxes of Sebasticook Grange No. 90.
- Art. 34. To see if the town will vote to authorize the town treasurer to execute for and in behalf of the town a deed releasing the town's interest in those lots of real estate on which the town has acquired an interest by enforcement of tax liens when the tax on such lots are paid.
- Art. 35. To see if the town will vote and authorize the selectmen to take such action as they may deem proper in regard to the sale of those lots of real estate on which the town has acquired an interest by enforcement of tax liens providing they receive the amount of the unpaid taxes or more; and authorize the town treasurer to execute for and in behalf of the town a deed releasing the town's interest in such lots, or take any action in relation thereto.
- Art. 36. To see if the town will vote and raise money necessary to wire the Reynolds' Corner school building for electric lights.
- Art. 37. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of \$150 for white pine blister rust control
- Art. 38. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of \$300 for dependent children.

Art. 39. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of \$240 for Mothers' Aid.

Art. 40. To see if the town will authorize the School board to make a contract for high school tuition.

Art. 41. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending school committee and citizens of Burnham:

I herewith submit the following report on the condition of your schools for the fiscal year 1937-38.

The general standing of the schools is very good. It was found necessary to close the Eelweir school last fall due to there being less than eight attending the school. These children and as many more that wish are being conveyed to the village. This has resulted in a saving of \$120 besides giving them a much higher standard of instruction in a graded school. At present time there is an enrollment of 10 in the Mount school. This school could be closed and these children conveyed to the village at a saving of \$275 per year. These savings should be given serious consideration with the town in its present financial condition.

HIGH SCHOOL TUITION

The amount of money you have to pay for tuition has increased during the past few years. The number of students going on to a secondary education has increased from 21 to 34 this last year. This has meant an increase of about \$1000 in your tuition bill. During the past two or three years the town has continued to raise \$3,500 for schools. This with what was received from the State was sufficient a few years ago to pay all bills. Now, due to the fact that the town has not increased its appropriation each year to take care of this added cost of tuition we find that the town will owe the following amounts as of March 1st.

In other words there has not been enough money raised each year to pay for the increased cost of Tuition. It has also cost the Town over \$400 during the past two years by not being able to pay these bills when they came due and in added interest charges.

BUDGET

Following is an itemized budget showing the amounts necessary to run the schools of the town and pay up all outstanding bills for the coming year. No allowance has been made for raising teachers' salaries, or on conveyance over the past year.

The attendance of your high school students for which you are paying tuition is listed as follows: M. C. 1., 16; Clinton, 9; Unity, 8; Augusta, 1; making a total of 34 for the first half school year. From the large number graduating this spring it looks as if this number would be increased another year. Provision for this increase will be recommended in the school budget.

CONCLUSION

This year the Town did not receive any money from the equalization fund. The school rate was high enough, but the tax rate lacked one fourth mill of coming under the State average. Next year the school rate will be .01243 and the municipal rate will be .05736, which means that if the town raises the amount asked for schools and the tax rate of the Town is 55 mills or more, you should receive a generous amount from the equalization fund.

The teachers and conveyance have worked for several weeks without getting any pay. They are carrying on, cooperating with the School Committee and the Superintendent, trying to keep the schools open so that our youngsters may have the advantage of the best education that we can give them under the very adverse conditions.
