# Town Warrant

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To W. E. Reynolds, a Constable of the Town of Burnham in the County of Waldo, GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the Inhabitants of the town of Burnham, in said County, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Burnham Town Hall, in said town on Monday, the 10th day of March, A. D. 1941, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles namely:

Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the reports as submitted by the several town officers.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for support of schools.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for school repair.

5.A. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for salary of school board.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for town officers' salaries. (Recommend \$1,000.00)

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for town charges. (Recommend \$300.00)

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for payment on town debt. (Recommend \$1,000.00)

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for payment of interest. (Recommend \$1,150.00)

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for abatement and discount of taxes. (Recommend \$300.00)

DISBANDED

Art. 11 To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for highways and bridges. (Recommend \$500.00)

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the maintenance of State, State Aid, and Third Class roads. (Necessary \$977.20. State and State Aid \$457.20. Third Class \$520.00. Total \$977.20.)

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for snow removal and sanding for the ensuing year. (Recommend \$1,250.00)

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the removal of bushes on improved roads. (Recommend \$200.00)

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to appropriate for State Aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937. (Recommend \$799.50)

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for insurance of town property. (Recommend \$250.00)

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the care of cemeteries. (Recommend \$60.00)

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 to be held as a cemetery trust fund, the income from same to be used for the care of the M. P. Milliken lot.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$150.00 to be held as a cemetery trust fund, the income from same to be used for the care of the Stella Cunningham lot.

Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for street lights for the ensuing year (Recommend \$250.00)

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of twenty-five dollars for school nursing for the ensuing year.

Art. 22. To see what method the town will adopt for the collection of taxes for the ensuing year.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on all 1941 taxes paid before May 1st and said discount to be 5%.

Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will vote to grant and raise to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of \$250.00 for dependent children.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote and raise the sum of \$240.00 for Mothers' Aid.

Art. 27. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for W. P. A. to be used for the purchase of material and labor not supplied by W. P. A. funds. (Recommend \$1,000.00)

Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will vote and raise for the support of poor. (Recommend \$1,250.00)

Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer to make temporary loans for the town to be paid during the current year by taxes and the selectmen to issue notes for and in the name of the town for the loans made and to issue bonds when necessary.

Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to authorize the town treasurer to execute for and in behalf of the town a deed releasing the town's interest in those lots of real estate on which the town has acquired an interest by enforcement of tax liens when the tax on such lots are paid.

Art. 31. -To see if the town will vote to authorize a majority of the selectmen to sell at such consideration as they deem advisable all the town's title and interest, now and hereafter acquired under tax liens, and authorize the Town Treasurer to execute for and in behalf of the town a deed conveying the town's interest and title thereof to the purchaser.

Art. 32. To act upon any other business that may come before said meeting.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the above named hall and place of meeting on Monday the day of said meeting for the purpose of correcting the list of voters, from 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon until the polls are closed.

The above should read Village S. P., 1 boy and 2 girls. There has been a large increase in the elementary school enrollment this year. There will be 14 in the graduating class this year. The number of tuition students will remain about the same.

#### CONCLUSION

The School Committee and the Superintendent have administered the schools to the best of their ability during the past year. They have run the schools economically and efficiently. The fact still remains that there are a number of school accounts unpaid at present time. The reference is to the tuition and textbook accounts. Unless these accounts are paid promptly it will seriously interfere with the running of the schools. School supplies must be ordered this spring. The companies will not extend more credit until some effort is made to pay the old bills. The tuition will have to be paid before September 1, 1941, in full, before your high school scholars can enter in the fall. It will help considerably if the town can find some way to meet these demands. We are grateful for the cooperation given the schools this past year.

# Report of Public Health Nursing, 1940

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"Adequate provision to assure satisfactory growth and development and protection of the health of the children is a public responsibility warranting special consideration and emphasis in any program directed toward better health of the people as a whole. Upon what is done to assure physical and mental health during maternity, infancy, childhood and youth, depends the vigor and health of the adult population."

The above quotation was taken from the report of a conference on "Children in Democracy" held in Washington last spring, at which leaders in many fields of child care discussed the problem of youth, and the way to solve this problem.

Public Health Nursing is concerned with securing and maintaining better health for all members of the community. Recognizing that whatever is done to assure physical and mental health during maternity, infancy, childhood and youth will affect the health of the adult population, we have, as in the past, placed most emphasis with the pregnant mother, the infant and pre-school child.

During the year 42 visits were made, at the request of the attending physician, to prenatal patients to help them to carry out this instruction, or if not yet under a physician's care, to urge them to secure medical advice as early in pregnancy as possible. In many cases the mother was helped to make plans for her confinement. Special instructions were given to those mothers who were expecting to have a home confinement. During the year the nurse assisted with 2 deliveries in the home. Also daily home care was given the mother and new baby, as long as necessary, or some responsible person in the family taught how to do this.

77 visits were made to young infants to urge the mother to keep the infant under medical supervision, to have him vaccinated against smallpox, and immunized against diphtheria. When necessary, the nurse assisted the mother to plan a daily regime for the baby. Special emphasis was placed on the prevention of communicable diseases, which take such a heavy toll in childhood. Included in these visits were 165 visits to pre-school children.

Arrangements were made for 3 crippled children to attend one of the clinics conducted by the Bureau of Health. Fol-

low-up visits were made in the homes to assist the family with the care of the patient.

The assistance of the Consultant in Nutrition to visit homes where there was some outstanding nutritional problem, or to meet with community groups was of inestimable value.

While work in the schools has been limited this year, conferences were held with the teachers, and help given in solving social problems. During the year there were 35 pupils inspected.

All children with any deviation from normal health could, with their attending physician's consent, attend the pediatric clinic, conducted by the Bureau of Health. Here the children receive physical examination by a pediatrician, and dental examination by a dentist. Follow-up home visits by the nurse in these homes.

It is heartening to find an increased interest in health work on the part of community groups. The assistance given in all projects has in large measure been responsible for the accomplishments of the year.
