REPORT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of the Town of Byron:

Our present method of providing education for our children is the most progressive plan that could be followed. We are giving our children the advantages of attending a larger school system. We are giving them an opportunity to compete against, become acquainted with, and develop through the association with others of their own age. We are further guaranteeing to each boy or girl the privilege of obtaining a high school education. We are now able to say that we not only offer tuition privileges to high school students, but provide the means whereby the individual can avail himself of this opportunity. It is very possible that some children may be able to complete their high school studies, who would not be able to have this advantage if transportation were not made possible.

A similar method is being followed by other towns in comparative degrees.

I have followed closely the progress of the Byron children and am well pleased with the standing they maintain. They are accepted by their classmates and are maintaining satisfactory standards. By the teachers they are treated as members of the entire group and receive the same individual assistance that is accorded to any other child.

The bus service provided by Mr. Taylor has been very efficient. I am sure that he has conscientiously endeavored to carry out the duties of transportation to the best advantage of all.

The State Law regarding attendance states that "Children who are or will become at least six years of age on December 31 of the school year shall be admitted to grade one." In addition it says that children who are or will become five before October 15 may be admitted to the sub-primary grade. Mexico maintains this sub-primary grade as an integral part of its school system.

Although not essentially a part of a Byron School Report it nevertheless gives me great pleasure to say that the work of Miss Betty MacDougall, a teacher in the Mexico school system is very satisfactory.

The budget submitted for next year is based on the anticipated number of pupils who will be enrolled. I think it will cover all costs. An increase in school population might cause a slight overdraft, which however, could be taken care of next year.

Once again may I say that my associations with the people of Byron have been of a very friendly and pleasant nature.

WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

To Lenna S. Young, the Constable in the Town of Byron in County of Oxford, Greetings.

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Byron qualified by law to vote in Town Affairs to assemble at the Town Hall in said Town on Monday, the third of March, at ten thirty o'clock, Eastern Standard Time, in the forenoon to act on the following articles to wit:

- Article 1. To choose a moderator to preside over said meeting.
 - Article 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- Article 3. To choose Selectmen, Assessors, and Overseers of the Poor for the ensuing year.
 - Article 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Article 5. To establish a rate per cent for collecting taxes and to elect a Collector and Constable for the ensuing year.
- Article 6. To choose a member of the School Committee, for a term of three years.
- Article 7. To choose all other Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- Article 8. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the following by taxation on real and personal estates.
 - a. Support of Poor.
 - b. Maintenance and Support of Schools.
 - c. Repairs on Roads and Bridges.
 - d. Patrol.
 - e. Snow Removal on State Highways.
 - f. Abatements.
 - g. Cutting Bushes on Town Roads.
 - h. Town Officers.
 - i. Audit.
 - j. State Nurse.
 - k. Snow Removal on Town Roads.
 - 1. Discount.
 - m. Current Expenses.

- n. Third Class Maintenance.
- o. For care of Cemeteries.
- p. To defray all other Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- a. Run out Town lines.

Article 9. To see if the Town will allow a discount of 10 per cent on all real and personal taxes paid on or before September 1st 1947 and to charge interest on all taxes not paid on or before the first day of November, 1947.

Article. 10. To see if the Town will authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to hire such sums of money as may be necassary to pay Town Charges and Town Debts in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the money so borrowed to an amount not exceeding in the aggregate the total tax for the preceding municipal year as temporary loans to be paid during the year 1947 out of money raised during said year 1947 by taxes.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the Town to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes thereon on such terms as they deem advisable and to execute quit claim deeds for such property.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty Five Dollars (\$25.00) to be paid to the State of Maine Publicity Bureau to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 5, Section 82, of the Revised Statutes of Maine.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to pay and refund it's present outstanding note indebtedness as the same may fall due by authorizing and directing the Town Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen to issue and negotiate the the notes of the Town and any renewals of same in an amount not exceeding said present note indebtedness. The number, terms, and conditions of said notes to be determined by the Selectmen except that none of said notes shall be payable later than one year from date thereon.

Article 15. To establish a rate per hour for men, teams and trucks for work on Town Roads.

Article 16. To see what action the Town will take to paying for high school students in a Town charging more than their per capita rate.

Article 17. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for State Aid road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sections 25 and 29. Chapter 20, Revised Statutes 1944,, as amended.
