Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee and other Citizens of the Plantation of Caratunk:

I am pleased to submit to you my twelfth annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

Reports of this nature are liable to become somewhat trite and of passing interest. The financial summary is, usually, plain and the results tangible but educational progress and the work of the schools are more difficult to portray. Parents generally know what the school is accomplishing and judge accordingly. It is important, however, that they should visit and see the work going on, not once but several times during the year in order to have first hand information.

Due to the small size of the elementary schools this year, it was decided to combine them under one teacher. Should the time come when conditions warrant it will be easy enough to return to the two teacher plan. Mr. Reynolds in the high school and Mrs. Reynolds in the grades are continuing to supply the superior quality of teaching of last year. Mrs. Reynolds attended Farmington Normal Summer School during the vacation. There can be little to criticize in the work of teachers of such marked ability.

New movable desks were procured for the grade school which completes the project started some few years ago. Nothing else, materially, has been done in the way of repairs.

Mrs. Reynolds has revived the Junior Red Cross after the lapse of some years. This is a worthwhile project, I believe, teaching children to be more thoughtful of older people and other children and gives them an interest outside their own community. There is a marked improvement in all the children in their interest in good literature.

With a sizeable unexpended balance, small appropriations will be enough to carry on the work of the schools for the coming year. I would recommend \$1,400.00 for general school purposes and \$100.00 for repairs.

In closing this report, I want to thank all, Superintending School Committee, children, teachers, parents, and all other friends of the schools who have done their part in making this a good school year.

Warrant for Annual Plantation Meeting

MARCH 9, 1936

SOMERSET, ss.

STATE OF MAINE

To Harold W. Martin, Constable of the Plantation of Caratunk
in the County of Somerset. Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby requested to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Plantation of Caratunk qualified by law to vote in plantation affairs, to assemble at Albert B. Clark's hall in the said plantation on the 9th day of March, A. D. 1936, at one o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following articles, to-wit:

Art. 1—To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2—To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3—To choose three assessors and overseers of the poor for the ensuing year and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

Art. 4—To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.

Art. 5—To choose a collector for the ensuing year and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

Art. 6—To choose one or more members of the superintending school committee.

Art. 7—To elect a constable for the ensuing year.

Art. 8—To choose one or more fire wardens for the ensuing year.

Art. 9—To elect a road commissioner, fix his compensation and designate his time of service not exceeding three years.

Art. 10—To choose all other necessary plantation officers and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 11—To see if the plantation will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the plantation to State aid as provided in Section 20 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930.

Art. 12—To see what sum the plantation will appropriate and raise for the improvement of the section of State aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission (in addition to the amounts regularly raised in the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provision of Section 19, Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930 or under the provision of Section 3, Chapter 175, Public Laws of 1933.

Art. 13—To see what sum if any the plantation would recommend to take from the joint State aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State aid roads built within the last five years in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 271, Public Laws of 1931.

Art. 14—To see if the plantation will vote to authorize the assessors to rescind any amounts appropriated by the plantation for State aid highway construction in excess of the amount required to meet State apportionments

Art. 15—To see what sum the plantation will vote to raise for third class road maintenance

Art. 16—To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise for the making and repairing of highways and culverts in the said plantation and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

Art. 17—To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise for the making of snow roads in the plantation and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

Art. 18—To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise for the making and repairing of bridges for the ensuing year and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

Art. 19—To see if the plantation will vote to raise a sum of money and what sum for the maintenance of the State and State aid roads for the ensuing year within the limits of the plantation under the provision of Section 8 and 17 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.

Art. 20—To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise if any for the road patrol and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

Art. 21—To see what sum of money if any the plantation will vote to raise for cutting bushes on State aid roads and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

Art. 22—To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise for the support of schools for the ensuing year and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

Art. 23—To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise for the repair of school houses and school supplies for the ensuing year and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

Art. 24—To see if the plantation will vote to raise a sum of money for the school library and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 25—To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise for public welfare and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

Art. 26—To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise for the care of the cemetery for the ensuing year and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

Art. 27—To see if the plantation will vote to accept a sum of \$100.00 in trust in accordance with the provisions of Statute to provide for the perpetual care of Albert Williams' lot in Caratunk Cemetery, the income only to be used annually to provide for such care.

Art. 28—To see if the plantation will vote to accept a sum of \$100.00 to be used for perpetual care of the Claude L. Witham lot in Caratunk Cemetery.

Art. 29—To see if the plantation will vote to accept a sum of \$100.00 to be known as the Esther C. and Frank H. Sterling Memorial Fund for perpetual care of lot in Caratunk Cemetery.

Art. 30—To see if the plantation will vote to raise a sum of money and what sum to help defray the expense of painting the church and pass all votes respecting the same.

Art. 31—To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise to defray the necessary expenses and liabilities of the plantation for the ensuing year and pass all votes necessary respecting the same.

Art. 32—To see if the plantation will vote to authorize the assessors to hire money needed to transact the plantation business for the ensuing year in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 33—To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The assessors give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of receiving and correcting the list of voters, at Albert B. Clark's hall at 12 o'clock noon on the day of said meeting.

Hereof fail not and have you then and there this warrant with your doings thereon.
