In accordance with Chapter 16, Section 3 of the Revised Statutes of 1944 and at your request, the records of Caratunk Plantation have been audited by Auditor R. M. Parsons for the period February 21, 1946 to February 20, 1947 inclusive.

The examination was made in accordance with generally

accepted auditing standards applicable in the circumstances and included all procedures which were considered necessary. Insofar as could be ascertained within the scope of the examination, the financial transactions of the Plantation appear to have been appropriately handled.

Exhibits and Schedules incorporated in this report impartially present the financial position of the Plantation and the result of its operations for the period designated.

COMMENTS

Re: Audit of Accounts — Caratunk Plantation February 21, 1946 to February 20, 1947

CASH

Cash receipts issued were checked and found to be recorded correctly. All monies receipted for were deposited promptly. The cash balance of \$4,070.19 at the end of the fiscal year was reconciled and found to be in agreement with the depository. All expenditures were made by check from properly authorized warrants.

TAXES RECEIVABLE

The 1946 tax commitment book was added and checked, and found to be in agreement with the records of the Assessors. The total commitment, with the exception of \$106.68, was paid or abated.

Taxes unpaid were checked and listed.

Transactions affecting prior years' taxes were checked and taxes remaining unpaid were listed.

TAX LIENS

All transactions affecting tax liens were checked.

SURPLUS

The unappropriated surplus of \$2,981.01 at the beginning of the fiscal year was increased \$2.44 as a result of current operations.

GENERAL

The Tax Collector and Treasurer furnished corporate surety bonds.

The excise tax receipts were checked and it was ascertained that all collections had been paid to the Treasurer.

Vouchers and payrolls were checked to the extent deemed necessary, and as far as could be determined from this examination, the charges appeared to be proper and were correctly recorded.

The records of the various Plantation officials were found in a very satisfactory condition.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Superintending School Committee and other Citizens of Caratunk Plantation:

The one major problem in your Educational System this year, is a new school building, which is partially completed. This problem is one which your Building Committee and citizens of the town must solve yourselves. As your Superintendent, I am happy at any time to give assistance to your building program. I sincerely hope that your new building will be ready for use in the fall, and will be a building of which you will be proud. The present building, with its location right on the Main Highway is not safe for your children. Thus I urge all citizens of Caratunk to cooperate with your Building Committee, and School and Town Officials, to complete your new building at the earliest possible date.

Another problem, which can be solved by your teacher and Superintendent, is the revision of your School Curriculum to meet present day Educational Trends. This step is necessary too, if we are to eliminate any gaps and overlaps in our present set-up.

Our School this year has been broken up by Mrs. Hamilton's unfortunate accident, and by Miss Atkinson's resignation at Christmas time. However, with the small enrollment, which lends itself very favorably to individual pupil instruction, I feel the progress of the children at the close of the school year will be up to the high standards of the past.

We are asking for an increase in school appropriations this year, to care for increased costs of all school items. Our unexpended balance this year is very small in comparison with past years, which also cuts our funds on hand for schools.

Our books and supplies are in very good condition, and we hope to add some new books to the School Library again this year.

In closing, I wish to thank the members of the Superintending School Committee, town officials, teacher, parents and other citizens of Caratunk for their support of the schools.

Warrant for Annual Plantation Meeting

MARCH 8, 1948

SOMERSET, ss.

STATE OF MAINE

To Andrew M. Comber, Constable of the Plantation of Caratunk, in the County of Somerset.

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Plantation of Caratunk, qualified by law to vote in plantation affairs, to assemble at Albert B. Clark's hall in said Plantation on Monday, the 8th day of March A. D. 1948, at one-thirty o'clock in the afternoon, Eastern Standard Time, there and then to act upon the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the plantation will vote to accept the reports of the plantation officers as printed and distributed.
- Art. 4. To choose three Assessors and Overseers of the Poor for the ensuing year.
 - Art. 5. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
 - Art. 6. To choose a Collector for the ensuing year.

- Art. 7. To choose one or more members of the Superintending School Committee for the ensuing year.
 - Art. 8. To choose an Engineer for the ensuing year.
 - Art. 9. To choose a Constable for the ensuing year.
- Art. 10. To choose one or more Fire Wardens for the ensuing year.
- Art. 11. To choose a Road Commissioner, fix his compensation and designate his term of service, not exceeding three years.
 - Art. 12. To choose all other necessary plantation officers.
- Art. 13. To see what sum the plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for the making of Highways and Culverts for the ensuing year.
- Art. 14. To see what sum the plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for the making of Snow Roads for the ensuing year.
- Art. 15. To see what sum the plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sections 25 and 29, Chapter 20 of the Revised Statutes of 1944, as amended.

- Art. 16. To see what sum the plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for Road Patrol for the ensuing year.
- Art. 17. To see what sum the plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for Cutting Bushes the ensuing year.
- Art. 18. To see what sum the plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for the Support of Schools for the ensuing year.
- Art. 19. To see what sum the plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for the Repair of Schoolhouses for the ensuing year.
- Art. 20. To see what sum the plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for the Care of Cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- Art. 21. To see if the plantation will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of our state, under the provisions of Chapter 5, Section 82 of the Revised Statutes, said money to be expended through the Maine Publicity Bureau.
- Art. 22. To see what sum the plantation will vote to raise and appropriate as compensation for its officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 23. To see if the plantation will vote to instruct the Assessors to buy the bonds for the Treasurer and Tax Collector for the ensuing year.
- Art. 24. To see what sum the plantation will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the necessary expenses and liabilities of the plantation for the ensuing year.

- Art. 25. To see if the plantation will vote to install a street light at the lunch room.
- Art. 26. To see if the plantation will vote to install a street light near the cottage of Elmer Dore, said light to be on a four months basis.
- Art. 27. To see what action the plantation will take in regard to securing a location for a town dump.
- Art. 28. To see if the plantation will vote to allow a discount of 2% on taxes paid before June 1, and collect interest at the rate of 1% a month after September 1, the ensuing year.
- Art. 29. To see if the plantation will vote to authorize the Assessors on behalf of the plantation to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the plantation for the non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they may deem advisable, and to execute quit-claim deeds for such property.
- Art. 30. To choose any committee, hear the report of any and act thereon.
- Art. 31. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
- Art. 32. To see if the plantation will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$147.00 to pay interest charges for the ensuing year.

Art. 33. To see if the plantation will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 to pay the first note due on the new school building, said note being due on September 1st of the ensuing year.

The Assessors hereby give note that they will be in session at the above named hall and place of meeting on Monday, the day of said meeting, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters, from one o'clock in the afternoon, Eastern Standard Time, until the polls are closed.

Hereof fail not, and have you there and then this warrant with your doings thereon.
