## WARRANT

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STATE OF MAINE

PENOBSCOT SS.

*To Fred Tolman, a Constable of the Plantation of Carroll,*

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Plantation of Carroll qualified by law to vote in Plantation affairs, to assemble at the Grange Hall in said Plantation on the 28th day of March, A. D. 1938, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1 To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2 To choose a Plantation clerk.

Art. 3 To hear the reports of the Plantation officers.

Art. 4 To choose three assessors for the ensuing year.

Art. 5 To see if the Plantation will accept the lowest bid for the collection of taxes and have the collector give bonds to settle in full with the Plantation one year from date of commitment.

Art. 6 To choose a collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

Art. 7 To choose a Plantation treasurer for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To choose one or more constables for the ensuing year.

Art. 9 To choose a member of the school committee for three years.

Art. 10 To choose one or more road commissioners for the ensuing year.

Art. 11 To choose all other necessary Plantation officers.

Art. 12 To see what sum of money the Plantation will raise and appropriate for common schools for the ensuing year.

Art. 13 To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for secondary school tuition for the ensuing year.

Art. 14 To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for the repair of schoolhouses for the ensuing year.

Art. 15 To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for union superintendent of schools for the ensuing year.

Art. 16 To see what action the Plantation will take in regard to opening the McKenny school.

Art. 17 To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for patrol of roads.

Art. 18 To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise to defray Plantation charges.

Art. 19 To see if the Plantation will vote \$20.00 for public health nurse.

Art. 20 To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for incidental expenses for the ensuing year.

Art. 21 To see if the Plantation will vote and raise \$254.00 for the maintenance of third class roads for the ensuing year.

Art. 22 To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for the bush law, so called, for the ensuing year.

Art. 23 To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for maintenance of the special resolve road for the ensuing year.

Art. 24 To see if the Plantation will vote and raise the sum of \$72.00 to pay the interest on Carroll School fund.

Art. 25 To see what action the Plantation will vote in regard to plowing the roads for automobiles for the ensuing year.

Art. 26 To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for plowing roads.

Art. 27 To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for the care of ways, highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Art. 28 To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for State Aid road construction in addition to the amounts regularly raised for care of ways, highways and bridges under the provision of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.

Art. 29 To see what action the Plantation will take relative to authorizing the Plantation treasurer to borrow money during the present municipal year in anticipation of and to be paid out of the taxes of the current municipal year of 1938-1939 not exceeding three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) and to execute and deliver the negotiable promissory note or notes of the Plantation therefor.

Art. 30 To see if the Plantation will vote to authorize the assessors on behalf of the Plantation to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Plantation for non-payment of taxes thereon, such terms as they deem advisable and to execute quit-claim deeds for such property.

Art. 31 To see if the Plantation will vote that each dog owner who has not paid his dog tax by May 1, 1938, shall pay the cost of collection of said tax.

Art. 32 To see what action the Plantation will take relative to joining the Maine Municipal Association.

Art. 33 To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for the purchase of snow fence for the ensuing year.

Art. 34 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

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The assessors will be in session at the Grange Hall at 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters on said day of meeting.
