## WARRANT

#### STATE OF MAINE

PENOBSCOT, SS.

To Fred Tolman, a Constable of the Plantation of Carroll

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Plantation of Carroll, qualified by law to vote in Plantation affairs, to assemble at the Grange Hall in said Plantation on the 30th day of March, A. D. 1942 at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2. To choose a Plantation clerk.
- Art. 3. To hear reports of Plantation officers.
- Art. 4. To choose three assessors for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To see if the Plantation will accept the lowest bid for the collection of taxes and have the collector give bonds to settle in full with the Plantation one year from date of commitment.
  - Art. 6. To choose a collector of taxes for the ensuing year.
  - Art. 7. To choose a Plantation treasurer for the ensuing year.
  - Art. 8. To choose one or more constables for the ensuing year.

- Art. 9. To choose a member of the school committee for three years.
- Art. 10. To choose one or more road commissioners for the ensuing year.
  - Art. 11. To choose all other necessary Plantation officers.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the Plantation will raise and appropriate for common schools for the ensuing year.
- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for secondary school tuition for the ensuing year.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for repair of schoolhouses for the ensuing year.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for the patrol of roads for the ensuing year.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for defraying Plantation charges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 17. To see if the Plantation will vote and raise twenty dollars (\$20.00) for public health nurse for the ensuing year.
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for incidental expenses for the ensuing year.
- Art. 19. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for the maintenance of third class roads.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for the maintenance of special resolve road for the ensuing year.

- Art. 21. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for the bush law, so-called, for the ensuing year.
- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for the care of cemeteries for the ensuing year.
- Art. 23. To see if the Plantation will vote and raise the sum of \$72.00 to pay the interest on Carroll school fund for the ensuing year.
- Art. 24. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for snow plowing the roads for the ensuing year.
- Art. 25. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for the care of ways, highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 26. To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for state aid road construction in addition to amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges under the provision of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930 or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.
- Art. 27. To see if the Plantation will vote and raise \$375.00 for snow fence bought in 1941.
- Art. 28. To see how much money the Plantation will vote and raise for snow fence for the ensuing year.
- Art. 29. To see if the Plantation will vote to insure school buildings and raise money for same.
- Art. 30. To see what action the Plantation will take relative to authorizing the Plantation treasurer to borrow money for the present municipal year in anticipation of and to be paid out of taxes of current municipal year 1942-43 not exceeding (\$3,000) three thousand dollars and to execute and deliver the negotiable promissory notes of the Plantation therefor.

- Art. 31. To see if the Plantation will vote to authorize the assessors on behalf of the Plantation to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Plantation for non-payment of taxes thereon by such terms as they deem advisable and to execute quit claim deeds for such property.
- Art. 32. To see what action the Plantation will take regarding the establishing of a sinking fund for the building of a centralized schoolhouse and raising money for same.
- Art. 33. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The assessors will be in session at the Grange Hall at 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters on said day of meeting.

#### **COMMENTS**

#### TREASURER:

All cash received as recorded appeared to be properly accounted for and supported by receipts on file. The check book balance was in agreement with cash book balance and reconciled with the bank statement as at the close of the year. The expenditures were made from warrants authorized by the Selectmen, and vouchers covering the various warrants were on file.

#### TAXES:

The tax commitment was checked with the Assessors' records and found to be in agreement. Taxes committed were accounted for either in cash, tax liens, or taxes still outstanding. Your uncollected taxes carried as assets are subject to a possible shrinkage. A reserve account has been set up for uncollected taxes for the years 1939-40 in addition to the reserve set up for years 1937-38. GENERAL:

With the exception of cash, no external verification was made of your asset and liability accounts.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

#### First:

I would recommend that insurance be placed on school buildings and contents. In case of a fire loss, the replacement cost would become a burden upon the town which might have been saved had insurance been carried upon the property.

#### Second:

I would recommend that uncollected taxes for years 1937-38-39, if found to be uncollectible, be abated.

#### Third:

According to the ruling of the new State Assessor taxes must be assessed on all town owned property taken by tax lien process against the owner or occupant. I would recommend that this be done.

#### Fourth:

I would recommend that interest be charged on all uncollected taxes.
