Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money, and if so, how much for the suppression and prevention of tuberculosis.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for Mapleton Fire Department.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be expended for the maintenance of the improved section of state aid road not under patrol.
