

AUDITOR'S REPORT

Houlton, Maine March, 21, 1938

To the Tax Payers of Castle Hill:

I have audited the books of your Selectmen, Treasurer and Tax Collector for the year ending March 1, 1938, the Treasurer's cash on hand reconciles with the Bank statement. The Collector's unpaid taxes together with cash on hand undeposited equals his account within \$3.40 which is undoubtedly an error in computation of interest.

I have verified and set up in Liabilities all unpaid obligations of the town, detail of which you will find in the Town Debt Analysis. I have also written off old accounts and notes considered to be worthless so that the balance sheet will reveal the correct financial standing of the town at the close of its fiscal year.

I would recommend that you vote to sell your B. & A. Bonds in order to further reduce your Liabilities thereby getting your indebtedness down as near as possible to the Statutory 5% of your valuation.

By doing this it appears possible that you might be able after town meeting to fund your total indebtedness into a serial bond issue, this would mean a saving to you in interest of at least $1\frac{1}{2}\%$. I propose to acquire some information on this matter and hope to be able to present it to you at your annual town meeting.

WARRANT

To Herman McHatten, a Constable in the town of Castle Hill, in said County; Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Castle Hill, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Grange Hall, in said town on Monday, the 28th day of March, A. D. 1938, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
 - Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the report as printed.
 - Art. 4. To choose all other necessary town officers.
- Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to fix a date when taxes shall be due and payable.
- Art. 6. To vote the compensation of the tax collector.
- Art. 7. To see if the town will vote that poll taxes shall be due and payable the first of May, 1938.
- Art. 8. To see if the town will charge interest on taxes after certain date, and if so, how much, and what dates.
- Art. 9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of highways and bridges.

- Art. 10. To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for State Aid construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways, and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, P. L. 1937.
- Art. 11. To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint State Aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid roads, in excess of the requirements of of Section 2, Chapter 132, P. L. 1935.
- Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$175 for the maintenance of improved sections of third class roads or to be used in conjunction with State apportionment for the construction of third class roads.
- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for common schools for the ensuing year.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for high school tuition for the ensuing year.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs and appliances for the ensuing year.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for text books for the ensuing year.
- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town officers' salaries for the ensuing year.

- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for incidental expenses for the ensuing year.
- Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest and insurance for the ensuing year.
- Art. 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of poor for the ensuing year.
- Art. 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for mothers' aid for the ensuing year.
- Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to make temporary loans when necessary in anticipation of collection of taxes.
- Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so, how much for the suppression and prevention of tuberculosis.
- Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Mapleton Fire Department.
- Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be expended for the maintenance of the improved section of State Aid road not under patrol.
- Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to apply on town debt.
- Art. 27. To see if the sum of \$36.00 or more will be raised and appropriated for school nursing in the town of Castle Hill to be expended under the auspices of the Bureau of Health of the State Department of Health and Welfare.

- Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to apply to the Highway Commission for snow removal on certain roads, if so, what roads; and raise and appropriate money necessary for same.
- Art. 29. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to purchase equipment for snow removal.
- Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen and Treasurer to continue to hold town orders until paid.
- Art. 31. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to sell and dispose of tax titles held by the town on such terms as they deem advisable and to execute quitclaim deeds for such property.
- Art. 32. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the improvement of the Turner Road so called.
- Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to adopt resolution to be presented to the Congress of the U. S. regarding lower tariff and increase of importations of foreign potatoes.
- Art. 34. To see what action the town will vote to take on bill due the town of Wade for Road construction during the year 1928.
- Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to allow discount on taxes paid before certain date, and if so, how much, and what date.
- Art. 36. To see what action the town will take regarding the disposal of Railroad bonds.
- Art. 37. To see what action the town will vote to take in regard to joining the Maine Municipal Association.

Art. 38. To transact any other business which may lawfully come before said meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session one hour before said neeting, Grange Hall, to correct list of voters.
