Our schools have run successfully through another year.

It is suggested that we should raise the small sum asked by the State Bureau of Health so that the schools may have the benefits offered by the department. The health of our children is more important than many other things. By working with the State we may be assured of helpful

attention at a fraction of the cost that the parents would incur through private medical services.

It is recommended that the School Committee be instructed to maintain the Richardson School.

Attention is called to the good work that our teachers are doing. Their efforts should be rewarded by financial support. The town raised a substantial amount which should be sufficient to make the teachers' salaries somewhat higher than the present level. After the appropriation has been made, a reduction in wages does not lower the tax rate. The State is to give us a generous sum to keep the length of the school year up to the standard and to improve instruction. It would seem that the teachers should be given enough to enable them to attain a greater degree of professional growth. The schools should be run without waste, but it would not be economy to attempt to take too much from a wise expenditure and by so doing to lose some State aid.

The citizens are to be commended for their support of the schools. It is hoped that as time goes on increased funds may be secured from higher authorities without loss of local control.

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## WARRANT

To Herman McHatten, a Constable in the town of Castle Hill, in said County; Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Castle Hill, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at Grange Hall, in said town on Monday, the 27th day of March, A. Art. 11. To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint state aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to state aid roads, in excess of the requirements of Section 2, Chapter 132, P. L. 1935.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to make temporary loans when necessary in anticipation of collection of taxes.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so, how much for the suppression and prevention of tuberculosis.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be expended for the maintenance of the improved section of State Aid roads not under patrol.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Mapleton Fire Department.

Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to apply on town debt.

Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise, and raise the sum of \$.05, or any part thereof, per capita, to be expended and used solely for advertising the attractions, advantages and natural resources of Aroostook County and of the Town, the same to be expended through and by the Aroostook Development Association, Inc. with the cooperation of the Maine Potato Growers and Shippers Committee, Inc., Aroostook County Council, Maine Development Commission and State of Maine Publicity Bureau."

Art. 29. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$47.00 for public health work in Castle Hill, said sum to be expended by the Bureau of Health, State Department of Health and Welfare, in cooperation with local authorities.

Art. 30. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Superintending School Committee to maintain the Richardson School, so called, through the school year 1939-1940, as recommended in the annual School Report.

Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to apply to the Highway Commission for snow removal on certain roads, if so, what roads; and raise and appropriate money necessary for same.

Art. 32. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to purchase equipment for snow removal.

Art. 33. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to sell and dispose of tax titles held by the town on such terms as they deem advisable and to execute quit-claim deeds for such property.

Art. 34. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the improvement of Turner Road so called.

Art. 35. To see if the town will vote to allow discount on taxes paid before a certain date, if so, how much and what date.

Art. 36. To transact any other business which may lawfully come before said meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session one hour before said meeting, at Grange Hall, to correct list of voters.
