WARRANT

To Herman McHatten, a Constable in the Town of Castle Hill, in the County of Aroostook and in the State of Maine.
Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Castle Hill, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Grange Hall, in said town on Monday, the 24th day of March, A. D. 1941, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles to wit:

Art. 1 To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2 To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3 To see if the town will vote to accept the report as printed.

Art. 4 To choose all other necessary town officers.

Art. 5 To see if the town will vote to fix a date when taxes shall be due and payable.

Art. 6 To vote the compensation of the tax collector.

Art. 7 To see if the town will vote that poll taxes shall be due and payable the first day of May, 1941.

Art. 8 To see if the town will vote to charge interest on taxes after certain date, if so, how much, and what date.

Art. 9 To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges.

Art. 10 To see what sum the town will raise and appropriate for State Aid Road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.

Art. 11 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the assessors to rescind any amounts appropriated by the town for the State Aid Highway construction in excess of **the amount** required to meet State apportionments.

Art. 12 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$224.00 for the Maintenance of improved Sections of Third Class roads or to be used in conjunction with State apportionments for construction of Third Class roads.

Art. 13 To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the third class apportionment for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to Third Class roads, in excess of the requirements of Section 1, Chapter 207, P. L. 1939.

Art. 14 To see what sum of money the town will

vote to raise and appropriate for common schools for the ensuing year.

Art. 15 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for High School tuition for the ensuing year.

Art. 16 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs and appliances for the ensuing year.

Art. 17 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for text books for the ensuing year.

Art. 18 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town officers salaries for the ensuing year.

Art. 19 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for incidental expenses for the ensuing year.

Art. 20 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest and insurance for the ensuing year.

Art. 21 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of poor, for the ensuing year.

Art. 22 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Mother's Aid for the ensuing year.

Art. 23 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to make temporary loans when necessary in anticipation of collections of taxes.

Art. 24 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for aid to dependent children for the ensuing year.

Art. 25 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, and if so, how much for the suppression and prevention of tuberculosis.

Art. 26 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Highway patrol.

Art. 27 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be expended for the maintenance of the improved section of State Aid roads not under patrol.

Art. 28 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Mapleton Fire Department.

Art. 29 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to apply on town debt.

Art. 30 To see if the town will vote to raise, and appropriate the sum of \$.05 or any part thereof, per capita, to be expended and used solely for advertising the attractions, advantages and natural resources of Aroostook County and of the Town, the same to be expended through and by the Aroostook Development Association, Inc. with the cooperation of the Maine Potato Growers and Shippers Committee, Inc., Aroostook County Council, Maine Development Commission and State of Maine Publicity Bureau.

Art. 31 To see if the town will raise and appropriate \$47.00 for public health nursing in Castle Hill. Said sum to be expended by the Bureau of Health, for local service.

Art. 32 To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to apply to the Highway Commission for snow removal on certain roads, if so, what roads; and raise and appropriate money necessary for same.

Art. 33 To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to sell and dispose of tax titles held by the town on such terms they deem advisable and to execute quit-claim deeds for such property.

Art. 34 To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the improvement of Turner Road so called.

Art. 35 To see if the town will vote to allow discount on taxes paid before a certain date, if so, how much and what date.

Art. 36 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for snow fence.

Art. 37 To see if the town will vote to purchase the building formally used as the Haystack School house from Mr. Webber and appropriate a sum of money for same.

Art. 38 To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to lay out a road from the State Highway to a lot owned and occupied by Mrs. Annis Sharp and determine the location of same.

Art. 39 To see how much the town will vote to raise and raise for the purchase of a safe for the protection of the town records as provided by statute.

Art. 40 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Castle Hill Cemetery.

Art. 41 To transact any other business which may lawfully come before said meeting.

Art. 42 To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to employ a Town manager under the provisions of Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1939 and to fix the Compensation for said town manager.

The selectmen will be in session one hour before said meeting, at the Grange Hall, to correct the list of voters.
