SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Committee and Citizens of the Plantation of Caswell:

I hereby present the annual report of the school department for the fiscal year ending March 1, 1944:—

Increased cost in fuel, labor for conveyance, and teachers' salaries has caused us to be overdrawn in our school account. But on the whole we have reason to feel that we have done well under the present conditions. When we think of the boys who have gone out from our town to meet the call of our country and all that it means we realize that we must all do our best to help the young people now with us to get an educational preparation for the uncertain days that lie ahead of us.

To meet the situation we must recognize the fact that prices and wages will not be any lower for the coming year and there may also be new problems arise, which will require money. In considering these facts and estimating as nearly as possible the probable expenses, the sum of \$6,000.00 is suggested as the amount of appropriation for general school account.

Some repair work was done on the buildings during the past year and with a few minor repairs they will be all right for another year. It will be almost impossible to get help for work of that kind at the present time.

All who have contributed to the success of the school work during the past year should be commended.

WARRANT

To Omar O'Neal, Constable of the Plantation of Caswell, in the County of Aroostook and State of Maine,

Greeting:—

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Caswell Plantation, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the PLEASANT RIDGE SCHOOLHOUSE on MONDAY, the TWENTY-SEVENTH DAY OF MARCH, A. D. 1944, at TEN O'CLOCK in the FORENOON, to act upon the following articles, viz.:—

- Art. 1 To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art. 2 To choose a plantation clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3 To see if the plantation will vote to raise the sum of \$10,000.00 to buy equipment to plow snow on town roads; said amount to be in addition to the regular assessments and to be paid to the collector by June 1, 1944.
- Art. 4 To see if the plantation will vote to accept the plantation report.
- Art. 5 To choose all necessary plantation officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6 To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise for the support of schools and all school officers.
- Art. 7 To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise for the payment of all plantation officers and plantation charges, including in-

surance.

- Art. 8 To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise for the support of the poor, including A. D. C., board and care and inst. services.
- Art. 9 To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise for ways and bridges, including third-class repair, snow removal and maintenance of state highway, maintenance of stateaid and town roads.
- Art. 10 To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise for the Limestone Fire Department.
- Art. 11 To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise for nursing, health and tuberculosis.
- Art. 12 To see what sum of money the plantation will vote to raise on plantation debts.
- Art. 13 To see what disposition the plantation will make of money received from the excise.
- Art. 14 To see if the plantation will vote that poll taxes be due and payable May 1, 1944, and to determine a date when all other taxes shall be due and payable, and the rate of interest to be collected thereafter.
- Art. 15 To see if the plantation will vote to allow a discount on the 1944 taxes paid prior to Sept. 1, 1944, said discounts to be determined by the selectmen.
- Art. 16 To see if the plantation will vote to authorize the treasurer and selectmen to issue a note or

notes for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes, said note or notes not to exceed the total tax levy of the preceding municipal year and said note or notes to be paid during the current municipal year out of money raised during said current municipal year by taxation.

- Art. 17 To see if the plantation will vote to authorize the selectmen and treasurer, on behalf of the plantation, to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the plantation for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quitclaim deeds for such property.
- Art. 18 To see what action the plantation will take to set up a fund for the future welfare of the plantation.
- Art. 19 To transact all other necessary business.

The selectmen will be in session at the Pleasant Ridge Schoolhouse on Monday, the twenty-seventh day of March, A. D. 1944, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
