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

To the Superintending School Committee and Citizens of Centerville:

Once more I have the pleasure of submitting a report covering the operation of the schools of the Town of Centerville for the fiscal year ending March 1938.

This report will be found to contain an itemized account of all monies received and all monies expended.

Many new text books have been purchased for the school this past year including new supplementary readers, new health and science books for all grades in which these subjects are taught and new spellers for all grades.

Music has been introduced in the school this past year. I am happy to report that Miss Fitzpatrick has done a very creditable job in introducing music. The teacher has been supplied with music books, teacher's manual and pitch pipe. The health work of the school has been very capably carried on under the leadership of Miss Fitzpatrick.

New "Duo-Roll" window shades have been purchased for the school room. By means of this type of shade it is possible to uncover the entire window to admit the maximum amount of light on dull days, or to cover the entire window on bright sunny days, or the shades may be regulated to cover any portion of the window.

We now have three pupils attending high school, two at Columbia Falls and one at Jonesport. It seems likely that this number will be increased with the opening of schools next September.

I am making the following recommendations to cover the costs of operating the schools for the fiscal year ending March 1939:
