- Art. 8 To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen and Treasurer of the Town to obtain temporary loans for the Town from time to time during the coming municipal year, to be paid out of money raised by taxation, and make, execute and negotiate in the name of the Town a note or notes therefor, at such time and terms as to them seem advisable, and also to renew from time to time, as to them seems necessary, the whole or any part of such notes given.
- Art. 9 To see if the Town will vote to pay the Superintending School Committee for services rendered during the coming municipal year.
- Art. 10 To see if the Town will vote to accept the location of State-Aid Road as recommended by the State Highway Commission for the year 1936, it being a continuation of 1935 State-Aid construction.
- Art. 11 To see if the Town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the Town to State-Aid, as provided in Section 20, Chapter 28, of the Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 173, Public Laws of 1935.
- Art. 12 To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate for State-Aid Road construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the

care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Section 3, Chapter 173, Public Laws of 1935.

- Art. 13 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Assessors to rescind any amount appropriated by the Town for State-Aid Highway construction in excess of the amount required to meet State apportionments.
- Art. 14 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges, including winter breaking, for the ensuing year.
- Art. 15 To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$72.00 for the maintenance of third-class road, and the sum of \$42.00 for the maintenance of special resolve road for the ensuing year.
- Art. 16 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to lay out and accept a road on the center line, in said Chapman, extending south from the northeast corner of Lot No. 36 to the northeast corner of Lot No. 76, inclusive.
- Art. 17 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for common schools for the ensuing year.
- Art. 18 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for High School tuition for the ensuing year.
- Art. 19 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for textbooks and supplies for the ensuing year.

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- Art. 20 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for repairs and appliances for the ensuing year.
- Art. 21 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for insurance on schoolhouses.
- Art. 22 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 23 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for abatements.
- Art. 24 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay interest for the ensuing year.
- Art. 25 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to pay incidental expenses for the ensuing year.
- Art. 26 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of the poor for the ensuing year.
- Art. 27 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for mothers' aid for the ensuing year.
- Art. 28 To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money, and, if so, how much, to be expended under the direction of the local board of health, or public health officer, for the suppression and prevention of tuberculosis.
- Art. 29 To see what sum, if any, the Town would recommend to take from the joint State-Aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State-Aid roads, in excess

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of the requirements of Sec. 2, Chapter 132, Public Laws of 1935.

- Art. 30 To see if the Town will vote to empower the Selectmen and Treasurer to sell, rent or lease lands or sell stumpage from any lands acquired through tax lien expirations or sheriff sales, and give title for same, also to adjust values on said lands, as to them seem advisable.
- Art. 31 To see if the Town will vote to abate the mortgage now held on Alfred Gardiner's property.
- Art. 32 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State and Town, the same to be expended through the Aroostook County Council.
- Art. 33 To see if the Town will vote to have a budget committee for the ensuing year and elect same.
- Art. 34 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the place of said meeting at ten o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.
