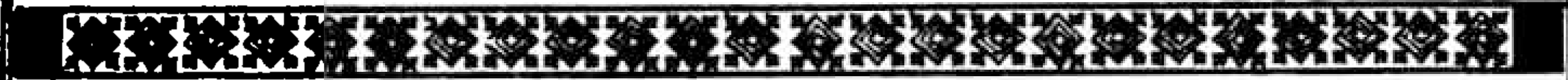

# Superintendent of Schools' Report

---

*To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the town of Chester:*

I have the honor of submitting herewith the annual school report.

We have maintained schools this year at Nos. 4, 5, and 6. School No. 5 was taught by Miss Inez Knights of Mattawamkeag for a short eight-week term and then closed for want of pupils, the patrons having moved. The school at No. 6 was taught by Mrs. Harriett Emerson Crowley of Lincoln for a fifteen-week term with good success. The attendance was good but the school had to be closed for the winter because it is almost impossible for the pupils to get to the school during the severe weather. This school will open again as soon as the weather and roads permit. School No. 4 in the Wyman district is being taught by Miss Addie Reed of Lincoln with good success. The attendance is good considering that it kept all winter and did not close even for one day because of the storms. This is rather remarkable as it is the only school in this supervisory district which did not lose any time because of stormy weather. Much credit is due to the teacher and her pupils. The wages paid in these three schools are \$12 in No. 5; \$15 in No. 6; and \$15 in No. 4.

The number of pupils registered in town for the school year ending July 1st 1919 was 17 boys and 23 girls, a total of 40. The number of tuition pupils in high school was three, all attending Winn High School.

Your attention is called to the need of shingling school house No. 4. The roof is in poor condition and it is not economy to let these things go. I would recommend that the repairs appropriation be made large enough so as to permit this repair work to be done. A good

foundation ought to be put under this building. This may be either of cement or cement blocks. If these things can be tended to now, it will save larger expense later.

I call your attention also to the need of increasing our appropriation for teachers' wages. There is increasing difficulty in securing competent teachers for the rural districts, as there is a shortage of teachers, and it is in the rural districts where this shortage is most keenly felt. The State has increased its Equalization Fund by \$100,000 but the distribution of this fund will depend in a measure on the readiness with which the individual towns meet the emergency. It will therefore be well for us to increase the common schools appropriation. Materially teachers' wages all over the State are being increased from 25% to 75%. I therefore recommend for the support of common schools for the ensuing year \$1,200. For books and supplies \$50; and for repairs of school houses \$250; for high school tuition, \$50.

For financial statement I refer you to the report of the Selectmen.
