PLANTATION WARRANT

State of Maine, Washington, ss.

To LaForest Cohran, Constable of the Plantation of Codyville, in said County.

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Plantation of Codyville, qualified by law, to vote in Plantation affairs. to assemble at the School House in said Plantation on Tuesday, March 31, 1942, at one o'clock in the afternoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

Article 1

To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2

To choose a Plantation Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 3

To hear the Annual Plantation Report.

Article 4

'To choose a First Assessor for the ensuing year.

Article 5

To choose a Second Assessor for the ensuing year.

Article 6

To choose a Third Assessor for the ensuing year.

Article 7

To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 8

To choose a Tax Collector for the ensuing year,

Article 9

To choose a Road Commissioner for the ensuing year.

Article 10

To choose a Surveyor of Lumber, Wood and Bark for the ensuing year.

Article 11

To choose all other necessary Plantation Officers,

Article 12

To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote to raise and appropriate for Schools, including Textbooks, Tuttion, Transporation and Superintendent,

Article 13

To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for Winter Roads.

Article 14

To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for the Contingent Fund.

Article 15

To see if the Plantation will vote and raise \$50.00 to entitle the Plantation to \$50.00 from State for Spring Road Maintenance, under Sec. 9.

Article 16

To see if the Plantation will vote and raise \$210.90 to entitle the Plantation to \$30.00 per mile from State for Summer Road Maintenance, Sec. 18.

Article 17

To see if the Plantation will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the Plantation to State Aid.

Article 18

To see what sum the Plantation will raise and appropriate for State Aid Road Construction (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of Ways, Highways and Bridges) under the provisions of Section 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Chapter 213, Public Laws of 1941.

Article 19

To see if the Plantation will grant and authorize the Plantation officers to hire such sum of money as may be necessary for State Aid Road construction.

Article 20

To see if the Plantation will vote and raise such sum of money as Interest on any funds secured under Article 19.

Article 21

To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for Plantation roads, exclusive of State Aid road, 50-50 road and patrol work.

Article 22

To see what per cent commission the Plantation will grant to tax collector for Collection of Taxes for the ensuing year.

Article 23

To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for care of Cemetery.

Article 24

To see what sum of money, if any, the Plantation would recommend to take from the Joint State Aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to State Aid Roads, in excess of the requirements of Section 2, Chapter 132, P. L. 1935.

Article 25

To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for prevention of Tuberculosis and Public Health.

Article 26

To see what sum of money the Plantation will vote and raise for a Minister.

Article 27

To see if the Plantation will vote to set a date on which all taxes shall be due and payable.

Article 28

To see if the Plantation will vote a Discount on Taxes that are paid on or before that date, and if so how much.

Article 29

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Assessors hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the place of said meeting in said Plantation on the 31st day of March, A. D. 1942, at ten o'clock, A. M.
