## WHEN A HORSE IS A STARTER

If while betting is in progress, a horse should be excused by the Stewards, because of accident or casualty before leaving for the post, the pooling is not affected thereby. The tickets purchased on the horse that has been declared are redeemed at their cost value, such amount being subtracted from the pool. If, however, a horse has left the paddock for the post it becomes a "starter" and all bets on it stand whether it starts or not.

In the event of a horse being excused by the Stewards, all bets recorded on the horse withdrawn, either Straight, Place or Show, will be refunded, but the amount bet will be included in the total of the pools, and any estimate as to the odds against any particular horse starting, must be calculated after the amount of the refund has been deducted from the total of the pools.
