STUDENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

PRESENT: Chairman J. C. Donovan, Miss L. M. Cormier, S. J. Evans, S. T. Hughes, L. M. Cutler, P. A. Riley (UMO); K. H. Ramage and Clerk J. R. Magill. Staff: S. L. Freeman and Miss M. A. Haas.

Chairman Donovan convened this first meeting of the Committee which was constituted in accordance with the revised By-Laws of the Board of Trustees, adopted November 9, 1972, to be responsible for matters affecting the welfare of students.

The major portion of the meeting was devoted to consideration of appropriate roles and proper jurisdiction for the committee and there was consensus that it would be valuable to consult with students to receive their suggestions about options for committee roles. It was agreed that members of the University of Maine Organization of Student Governments would be invited to meet with the Committee at its next session on February 27, 1973. Miss Riley will compile a list of current student concerns for discussion at that meeting.

Dr. Freeman reported that Mrs. Sampson, Chairman of the ad hoc committee on Trustee Responsibility and Accountability had asked him to determine whether the Student Affairs Committee wished to discuss and make recommendations on the question of jurisdictional levels in the area of student affairs. Since the Committee is newly established and will need to develop its own role more fully, it was decided to defer to the ad hoc committee on the matter of Board jurisdiction.

There was informal discussion of possible study topics for future meetings and of the need to develop an effective format for Committee visitations to the individual Campuses, and Dr. Freeman will prepare some suggestions for Committee review at the next session. The Committee expects to arrange one or two visitations before the end of the Spring semester and the Clerk was instructed to have Campus schedules available at the next session.
