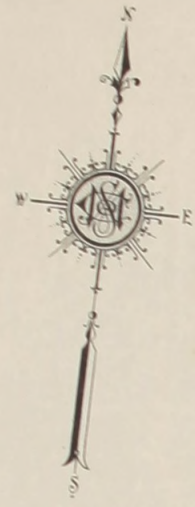

WATER FACILITIES

Gravity system of water works constructed 1887 and owned by Camden and Rockland Water Co. Water supply from Mirror Lake, situated ten miles North of Post Off. at an elevation of 365 ft. above high water mark, is led by springs and has a capacity of four million gallons. Ten miles of water pipe, 32 hydrants, pressure 45 lbs. at Post Off. Daily consumption not known. Numerous fire cisterns situated in various parts of the town for use of hand engines.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Volunteer. One chief, five assistants, 84 men, five companies. Gamewell fire alarm box in telephone office rings bell on 2nd Baptist Church. Four hose wagons, two hose reels, two hand engines, one hook & ladder truck, 3800 ft. 2 1/2" cotton, rubber lined hose in good condition. All of the above apparatus drawn by hand.
Engine house located on State Prison grounds, equipped with one Button 2nd class steam fire engine and one hose reel with 1000 ft. 2 1/2" hose, which can be used by the town in case of emergency.

Street not paved. Public lights electric.
