Continuing to combine education, advocacy and clinical services. At Mabel Wadsworth Center, we know we can best serve women by blending our clinical, educational, and advocacy services. A recent activity within the Center that continues to provide such blending is the cross-training of staff. Our education and outreach coordinator is now trained to educate women about pregnancy options, birth control options and abortion care. Likewise, members of our clinical staff worked together with administrative staff to create the Gaining Access Project (GAP), designed for uninsured clients. Emergency Contraception We knew when we began offering Plan B here at a reduced cost that it would improve access and we have been thrilled by an added benefit: education about Plan B and birth control. Women who come to the Center seeking Plan B have the option to meet with a clinician to discuss use, effectiveness and potential side effects AND many

have returned to the clinic for a follow-up appointment to discuss and obtain birth control!

Community Outreach We believe knowledge is power. This year we provided accurate and up-to-date information on sexual and reproductive health to various audiences. We presented at schools and colleges, the UU Church, Women's Re-Entry Program, and living rooms on topics such as abortion, safer sex, birth control, reproductive health and more!

My Body. My Voice Along with Spruce Run, we collaborated with UMaine's Safe Campus Project and Rape Response Services to educate our community about the connection between intimate violence and reproductive health. Performances were held for students, staff and faculty at the University of Maine and at a University of Maine, Presque Isle class on domestic violence that coordinated a public presentation for professionals from central Aroostook County.

Opening Up Sexuality is an essential part of our lives that is rarely discussed openly in our culture. The silence often leads to misinformation, feelings of shame and embarrassment. Opening Up is a series of workshops led by sexuality educator and wellness coach, Anastasia B. Anastasia presents information and facilitates conversations on an array of topics including sex toys, sexual fantasies and self-pleasure. The Opening Up workshops are judgment-free and a safe place to ask questions and share experiences. 
