Water Facilities Water Works Pumping Station at Crommelts Mills (See Sheet No. 11) 1 Deane Force Pump, Capy. 1,600,000 Galls. supply from Emerson Stream. 12 Miles of Water Pipes. Pressure on Main St. 105 lbs per Sq Inch, 60 Hydrants connected with the Lockwood Mills, system. Several reservoirs but all practically abandoned since water works were put in operation.

Fire Department. 1 Chief Engineer, 2 Assistants, 71 Call men—partly paid, 2 Permanent men, 4 horses, 1 Button Steam Fire Engine, 1 Hook & Ladder Truck, 2 Hose Reels (10 men to each) 2 Hose Wagons, 7200' 2½" Hose (Cotton-Rubber Lined) Gamewell Fire Alarm System, 15 Boxes.
