The February 6th, 2014, Thursday evening lecture was a success with more then twenty plus students, faculty and staff in attendance. Professor Blakely presented images and lectured on his photographic and digital work in reference to a contemporary view on American Modernist landscape painting.

On Friday, February 7^{th,} Professor Blakely conducted a workshop on Digital collage. Despite publicity, the attendance was not what we had hoped for; although the small group of participants enjoyed a very informative session that provided hands-on basics in digital imaging using Photoshop.

Blakely also meet with the Art Department faculty to discuss issues of digital curriculum in undergraduate art programs, and provided information about his school's digital offerings.

Colin Blakely's lecture and workshop were advertised through two separate e-mail fliers. Each was sent out once to the full CLAS College mailing list two weeks prior to the events and again five days before the events.
