Culturefest 2014

Culturefest is an annual event hosted by the International Student Association and the Office of International Programs. This day-long celebration of countries and cultures from around the world is a place for our international students to showcase their cultural traditions. US students from multicultural backgrounds also take part and celebrate their families' heritage. Each country or region will have a table to exhibit traditional items brought from home. There will also be a talent show with music, dances, and other performance art, children's activities and a fashion show for students to introduce their traditional clothing. For many, the best part of Culturefest is the food court which will offer a wide variety of food from around the globe.

Approximately 1200 people attend Culturefest each year. Members of the community as well as University of Maine students, staff and faculty have an opportunity to learn about the diversity of our student population and about countries and cultures outside the United States. Culturefest is also a great venue for students interested in study abroad and encourages those who may not have considered studying abroad to find out more. Children from the community are also welcome and special games, activities and artwork for children of all ages will be presented. This year we also hope to use Culturefest as an opportunity to showcase UMaine's many international pursuits which we believe will be of great interest to the public, including the many potential students attending the event. Faculty will be invited to share their internationally related work and answer questions from the event's participants.

One of the goals outlined in the Blue Sky Plan is to afford every University of Maine student an opportunity for global learning as it is a crucial element of today's university education. Culturefest is an excellent chance for everyone to come and explore many countries at once without the expense of traveling abroad. This is a very fun and educational event that international students look forward to participating in and UMaine students, faculty, and staff as well as members from the community look forward to attending.
