Dr. Juan Cole, the Richard P. Mitchell Collegiate Professor of History at the University of Michigan, will speak on "The Obama Administration and the Arab Youth Revolutions," at 7:30 p.m. on **December 1** in 110/120 Little Hall. The talk is sponsored by the Howard Schonberger Peace and Justice Memorial Lecture Series. Dr. Cole is the author of numerous books on the Middle East and Islamic world, including *The New Arabs: How the Millennial Generation is Changing the Middle East* (2014); *Engaging the Muslim World* (2009); and *Napoleon's Egypt: Invading the Middle East* (2007). He is also the founder of *Informed Comment*, a popular and critically acclaimed blog on current events in the Middle East, and has been a guest commentator on shows such as PBS's *Lehrer News Hour*, the *ABC Nightly News*, *Nightline*, the *Today Show*, *Charlie Rose*, *Rachel Maddow*, the *Colbert Report*, and *Democracy Now*.

In addition to his night-time talk, Dr. Cole will hold an informal 12:00 meeting with graduate students from the History Department and the School of Policy and International Affairs in 175 Stevens.

The Schonberger lecture series was created in 1993 to honor the memory of History Professor Howard Schonberger. Past speakers have included prominent scholars such as John Dower and Marcus Rediker who have attracted large and diverse audiences from the campus and local communities.

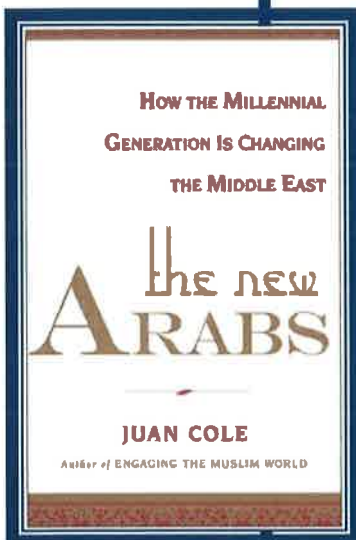

Final Report for CA/DLS: Howard B. Schonberger Peace and Social Justice Memorial Lecture for 2014

The Schonberger Lecturer for Fall 2014 was Juan Cole, the Richard P. Mitchell Collegiate Professor of History at the University of Michigan. Dr. Cole graduated from Northwestern University in 1975, received his MA in Arabic Studies at the University of Cairo in 1978, and received his PhD in Islamic Studies at UC LA in 1984. He is the author of numerous books, including *The New Arabs: How the Millennial Generation is Changing the Middle East* (2014), *Engaging the Muslim World* (2009), and *Napoleon's Egypt: Invading the Middle East* (2007).

The title of his Schonberger Lecture was "The Obama Administration and the Arab Youth Revolutions." It was held on December 1, 7:30 p.m. in 110 Little Hall with a reception following.

Attendance at the evening talk was about 80 people, and a number of people bought copies of Dr. Cole's books in the lobby afterward.

Publicity consisted of e-mails to relevant lists and a poster circulated on campus and in neighboring communities (see attached).
